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The **R.O.S.E. Scholarships** provide individuals with the tools to help them regain their self-esteem through college education and continuing education grants.

1. **R.O.S.E. Scholarship at UMASS Boston:** The R.O.S.E. Fund annually awards scholarships to accepted UMASS Boston students who are women survivors of domestic violence and have a proven record of college success and who are or will be enrolled in a minimum of 9 credits per semester.
2. **R.O.S.E. Continuing Education Grants:** The R.O.S.E. Continuing Education Grants range from \$200 to \$1000 per individual and must be used towards education or work related training to support women who have broken the cycle of domestic violence.
3. **R.O.S.E. Scholarship at Pine Manor College:** The R.O.S.E. Fund annually awards scholarships to accepted Pine Manor College students who are survivors of domestic violence and have a proven record of success and who are or will be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credits per semester.
4. **Cooking and Nutrition Workshop Series:** In September 2003 the R.O.S.E. Fund implemented a new Cooking and Nutrition Workshop Series to teach women valuable life skills. The workshop offers participants a support system while educating them about healthy, low cost and easy to prepare dishes.
