GOVERNMENT GRANTS LAW

Edward Byrne Memorial Competitive Grant Program: National Initiatives

US Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance

Program: This grant program assists local communities improve the capacity of local justice systems and provides for national support efforts. The FY 2008 program will focus on funding national efforts within five major categories: Category 1: Preventing crime and drug abuse, Category II: Enhancing local law enforcement, Category III: Enhancing local courts, Category IV: Enhancing local corrections and offender reentry and Category V: Facilitating justice information sharing.

Award: Total available funding: \$15 million

Eligibility: National, regional, state, or local public and private entities including for-profit (commercial) and nonprofit organizations, faith-based and community organizations, institutions of higher education, tribal jurisdictions, and units of local government that support national initiatives to improve the functioning of the criminal justice system.

Correctional Facilities on Tribal Lands Program

US Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance

Program: This program assists tribes in cost effectively planning and renovating facilities associated with the incarceration and rehabilitation of juvenile and adult offenders subject to tribal jurisdiction. There are two funding categories: **Category I: Planning of correctional facilities** and **Category II: Renovation of correctional facilities**.

Award: **Category I:** maximum award of \$150,000; **Category II:** maximum award of \$500,000

Eligibility: Federally recognized tribal governments

Award: Tier 1: 20 sworn officers or less: \$200,000; Tier 2: 21 sworn officers or more: \$400,000

Electronic and Cyber Crime Training and Technical Assistance Program

US Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance

Program: The purpose of this program is to improve the capacity of local criminal justice systems and provide national support for training and technical assistance projects that address electronic and cyber crime prevention needs.

Award: Total available funding: \$7 million; 1 to 3 awards

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE**FY 2008 Discretionary Grants for the
Family Violence Prevention and Services Program**

*US Department of Health & Human Services,
Administration on Children, Youth and Families,
Family and Youth Services Bureau*

Program: The primary purpose of this funding announcement is to provide financial support for the development of family violence intervention services and prevention efforts that are consistent with the Family Violence Prevention and Services Act (42 USC 10401 et. seq.). There are three priority areas of funding: **Priority Area I: Specialized Outreach Demonstration Projects for Services to Underserved and Diverse Populations:** this funding opportunity will support Institutes that convene researchers, activists, domestic violence survivors and practitioners to support coordinated outreach efforts to underserved and diverse communities, and to develop and promote culturally appropriate approaches to the elimination of domestic violence, **Priority Area II: Open Doors to Safety: Capacity-Building Grants for Domestic Violence Programs** (State Domestic Violence Coalitions are the eligible applicants): this funding opportunity offers State Domestic Violence Coalitions and the domestic violence programs they support the opportunity to expand their capacity to be accessible and effectively serve victims of domestic violence and their family members by identifying and addressing service barriers and **Priority Area III: TA for the Open Doors to Safety Grant Program:** this funding opportunity will support one project to provide technical support for recipients of the Open Doors to Safety: Capacity-Building Grants for Domestic Violence Programs.

Award: **Priority Area I:** Total available funding: \$1.7 million; 4 awards at \$425,000 each; **Priority Area II:** Total available funding: \$1 million; 5 awards at \$200,000 each; **Priority Area III:** 1 award at \$200,000

This curriculum will address healthy marriage and relationship skills for populations underserved in the general population and overrepresented in the child welfare system.

**Research on the Justice System Response to
Sexual Violence in Corrections**

US Department of Justice, National Institute of Justice

Program: The goal of this research and evaluation is to increase understanding and advance policy and practice aimed at reducing sexual violence in correctional facilities. NIJ is especially interested in the following two areas: cross-gendered supervision and strip and pat-down searches.

Award: Approximately \$2.4 million may become available for multiple awards

Eligibility: States (including territories), local governments (including federally recognized Indian tribal governments that perform law enforcement functions), nonprofit and profit organizations (including tribal nonprofit and profit organizations), institutions of higher education (including tribal institutions of higher education), and certain qualified individuals
