## **GOVERNMENT GRANTS CHILDREN**

### **Street Outreach Program (SOP)**

*US Department of Health & Human Services, Administration for Children and Families,  
Family and Youth Services Bureau*

**Program:** The purpose of this program is to conduct outreach services designed to build relationships between grantee staff and street youth. Education, intervention, and prevention services are offered to youth who are at risk of being subjected to sexual abuse or exploitation.

**Award:** Total available funding: \$2 million; 20 to 40 awards averaging \$100,000 each

**Eligibility:** Native American tribal organizations (other than federally recognized tribal governments), Indian/Native American tribally designated organizations, Nonprofits having a 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education, Nonprofits that do not have a 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education

**Deadline:** July 18, 2008

### **Demonstration Project Rural Host Homes for Basic Center Program**

*US Department of Health & Human Services, Administration for Children and Families,  
Family and Youth Services Bureau*

**Program:** The purpose of these grants is to establish new, or strengthen existing, community-based Basic Center Programs that use a host home model to provide temporary emergency shelter and care to runaway and homeless youth in rural settings.

**Award:** Total available funding: \$1 million; 10 awards averaging \$100,000 per budget period

**Eligibility:** State, county, local, city or township government, regional organizations, Indian/Native American tribal governments (federally recognized), Indian/Native American tribal organizations (other than federally recognized), Indian/Native American tribally designated organizations, public/Indian housing authorities, non-profits with/without 501(c)(3) IRS status (other than institutions of higher education), Hispanic-serving institutions, Alaska Native and Native Hawaiian serving institutions

**Deadline:** August 4, 2008

**COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT****National Providers of Training and Technical Assistance**

*Corporation for National and Community Service,  
Office of Leadership Development and Training*

**Program:** The purpose of this program is to fund organizations that provide training and technical assistance (TTA) to build the capacity of local programs and organizations that use service and volunteering to meet community needs.

**Award:** Total available funding: \$6 million; **YEAR ONE FUNDING:** Category 1: Member Training and Development: maximum amount of \$3.5 million; Category 2: Sustainability and Partnership Development: maximum amount of \$300,000; Category 3: Performance Measurement and Reporting: maximum amount of \$400,000; Category 4: Educational Success and Youth Development: maximum amount of \$250,000; Category 5: Disaster Services Support: maximum amount of \$250,000; Category 6: Disability Inclusion: maximum amount of \$1,000,000; Category 7: Special Initiatives and Projects: maximum amount of \$300,000; Category 8: Financial and Grants Management Support: maximum amount of \$300,000

**Eligibility:** State and local government entities, non-profit organizations, institutions of higher education, Indian/Native American tribes, and commercial entities; national organizations that currently operates a Corporation-funded program or are applying for other Corporation funding are eligible to apply.

**REFUGEE****FY 2009 Reception and Placement Program (R&P)**

*US Department of State, Bureau of Population, Refugees, and Migration*

**Program:** The purpose of the R&P program is to promote the successful resettlement of all persons who are admitted to the United States under the US Refugee Admissions Program.

**Award:** Each agency is paid a grant of \$850 for each refugee it sponsors who arrives in the United States during the period of the agreement and is verified to have been placed and assisted by the agency. In addition, the Bureau will fund national R&P Program management costs according to separately negotiated and approved budgets based on the agency's sponsorship capacity.

**Eligibility:** Well-established social services providers with demonstrated case management experience and experience managing a multi-regional network of offices that provide reception and placement or similar services to refugees or other migrant populations in the United States. Provide documentation of at least three full years of operation in a 501(c)(3) non-profit status (new applicants only); and document financial stability and the availability of financial resources to contribute to the program

**HIV/AIDS****2008 In Community Spirit - Prevention of HIV/AIDS for Native/American Indian and Alaska Native Women Living in Rural and Frontier Indian Country Program**

*US Department of Health and Human Services, Office on Women's Health*

**Program:** The purposes of this program is to increase HIV prevention knowledge and reduce the risk of contracting HIV among Indian/Native American and Alaska Native women living in Indian Country.

**Award:** Total available funding: \$240,000; approximately three two-year awards at a maximum of \$80,000 each

**Eligibility:** Nonprofit community-based organizations, faith-based organizations, national organizations, colleges and universities, clinics and hospitals, research institutions, state and local government agencies, tribal government and tribal/urban Indian entities and organizations.

**Deadline:** July 15, 2008

**2008 Request for Applications for the HIV Prevention Program for Young Women Attending Minority Institutions – Historically Black Colleges and Universities, Hispanic Serving Institutions, and Tribal Colleges and Universities**

*US Department of Health and Human Services, Office on Women's Health*

**Program:** The purpose of this program is to develop and implement a culturally and linguistically appropriate HIV/AIDS/STD prevention education program targeting young minority women on campus.

**Award:** Total available funding: \$960,000; 12 two-year awards at \$80,000 each; six to historically black colleges and universities, four to Hispanic serving institutions and two to tribal colleges and universities

**Eligibility:** Nonprofit community based organizations, faith-based organizations, national organizations, colleges and universities, clinics and hospitals, research institutions, state and local government agencies, tribal government and tribal/urban Indian/Native American entities and organizations may apply. Preference will be given to organizations indicating a history of serving minority women in a collegiate setting who have contracted HIV/AIDS or whose lifestyles place them at high risk for HIV/STD infection

**RESEARCH & EVALUATION****NIJ Graduate Research Fellowship 2009**

*US Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, National Institute of Justice*

**Program:** This is an annual program that provides assistance to universities for dissertation research support to outstanding doctoral students undertaking independent research on issues related to crime and justice. Topics of consideration include: violence and victimization; biometrics; corrections; criminal justice courts, prosecution, and defense; crime prevention/causes of crime; drugs, alcohol, and crime; forensic DNA; general forensics; transnational crime and justice; criminal or juvenile justice systems; law enforcement/policing; less lethal technologies; offender programs and treatment; operations research; personal protective equipment or pursuit management technologies.

**Award:** 10 awards at \$20,000 each

**Eligibility:** Accredited universities in the United States for support of students who have completed, or are near completion of, all doctoral degree requirements except the research, writing, and final defense of a dissertation; the fellowship recipient is eligible for funding only during months of enrollment in a full-time program leading to the doctoral degree

**Deadline:** November 21, 2008
