OFFICE ON VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN GRANTS

OVW FY 2008 STOP Violence Against Women Formula Grant Program

Program: The STOP Program supports communities in their efforts to develop and strengthen effective law enforcement and prosecution strategies to combat violent crimes against women and to develop and strengthen victim services in cases involving violent crimes against women.

Award: By statute, OVW will award a base amount of \$600,000 to each state. Funds remaining after the allocated base amount will be distributed among the states based on population.

Eligibility: Any state of the United States and its territories; faith-based and community organizations are eligible as long as they apply through their respective states for such funding

OVW FY 2008 Enhanced Training and Services to End Violence Against and Abuse of Women Later in Life Program

Program: The purpose of this program is to provide training to criminal justice professionals, governmental agencies and victim assistants to enhance their ability to address elder abuse, neglect and exploitation in their communities; providing cross training opportunities to professionals working with older victims; developing or enhancing a community coordinated responses to elder abuse; and providing or enhancing services for victims who are 50 years of age or older

Award: New funding may not exceed \$500,000; continuation funding may not exceed \$150,000

Eligibility: States, units of local government, Native American tribal governments or tribal organizations, and nonprofit, nongovernmental victim services organizations with demonstrated experience in assisting elderly women or demonstrated experience in addressing domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking, including faith- and community-based organizations

OFFICE ON VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN GRANTS*Continued***OVW FY 2008 Grants to Indian Tribal Governments Program**

Program: The Tribal Governments Program is designed to fulfill the three goals of Title IX: to decrease the number of violent crimes committed against Indian women; to help Indian tribes use their independent authority to respond to crimes of violence against Indian women; and to make sure that people who commit violent crimes against Indian women are held responsible for their actions.

Award: New applicants may apply for grant awards of up to \$450,000; continuation funding may not exceed \$900,000

Eligibility: Federally recognized Tribal Governments

OVW FY 2008 Grants to Encourage Arrest Policies and Enforcement of Protection Orders Program

Program: The purpose of this program is to encourage state, local, and tribal governments and state, local, and tribal courts to treat domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking as serious violations of criminal law requiring the coordinated involvement of the entire criminal justice system.

Award: Populations up to 500,000: maximum of \$400,000; populations of 500,001 to 900,000: maximum of \$750,000; populations over 900,000: maximum of \$1,500,000

Eligibility: States, units of local government, Indian tribal governments, and state, local, tribal, and territorial courts

BUREAU OF JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANTS

FY 2008 Edward Byrne Memorial State Justice Assistance Grant (JAG)

Program: This program allows states and local governments to support all components of the criminal justice system, from multi-jurisdictional drug and gang task forces to crime prevention and domestic violence programs, courts, corrections, treatment, and justice information sharing initiatives.

Award: JAG formula includes a state allocation consisting of a minimum base allocation with the remaining amount determined on population and Part 1 violent crime statistics, and a direct allocation to units of local government. Once the state allocation is calculated, 60 percent of the funding is awarded to the state and 40 percent to eligible units of local government.

Eligibility: States including the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, the Northern Mariana Islands, the Virgin Islands, Guam, and American Samoa.

Tribal Courts Assistance Program (TCAP) FY 2008 Competitive Grant Announcement

Program: The purpose of this program is to provide technical assistance and training of tribal court staff. Applicants may apply in one of the three categories - Category I: Planning and implementing an intertribal court system for smaller populations, Category II: Planning and implementing a single-tribe court system; and Category III: Enhancing or continuing the operation of tribal courts.

Award: **Category I:** grant maximum of \$200,000; **Category II:** grant maximum of \$200,000; **Category III:** Tribes and tribal consortia serving populations of less than 5,000 - grant maximum of \$150,000; tribes and tribal consortia serving populations of more than 5,000 – grant maximum of \$175,000

Eligibility: Native American tribal governments (Federally recognized) including Alaska Native villages and corporations, and authorized intertribal consortia. Recipients of FY 2006 or FY2007 TCAP grants are not eligible for FY23008 supplemental funding.

HUMAN SERVICES**Assets for Independence (AFI) Demonstration Program**

US Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Children and Families (ACF), Office of Community Services (OCS)

Program: The purpose of the AFI program is to provide financial awards and other supports to entities that administer AFI projects. These projects provide low-income individuals and families with access to special matched savings accounts called IDAs and other asset-building tools such as financial literacy education and coaching and training on money management and consumer issues.

Award: Total available funding: \$19 million; 55 to 65 awards averaging \$350,000 per project

Eligibility: State, county, local, city or township governments; regional organizations; independent school districts; public and state-controlled institutions of higher education; Indian/Native American Tribal governments (Federally recognized and other than Federally recognized); Indian/Native American Tribally Designated Organizations; public/Indian housing authorities; non-profits with 501(c)(3) IRS status (other than institutions of higher education); private institutions of higher education; Hispanic-serving institutions; Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs); Tribally Controlled Colleges and Universities (TCCUs); Alaska Native and Native Hawaiian Serving Institutions; special district governments

Deadline: January 15, 2008 and March 25, 2008; January 15, 2009 and March 25, 2009; January 15, 2010 and March 25, 2010

Program: The purpose of the program is to expand and advance the understanding of violence, its causes, and prevention strategies.

Award: Total available funding: \$1,800,000; 5 to 6 awards with a maximum amount of \$300,000

Eligibility: Public and private nonprofit organizations; for profit organizations; small, minority, and women-owned businesses; universities; colleges; research institutions; hospitals; community- and faith-based organizations; federally recognized or state-recognized American Indian/Alaska Native tribal governments; American Indian/Alaska Native tribally designated organizations; Alaska Native health corporations; urban Indian health organizations; tribal epidemiology centers; state and local governments or their Bona Fide Agents

Program: Interest is focused on research projects to address knowledge gaps related to trafficking in persons in the United States, especially research related to labor trafficking, demand reduction for sex trafficking and commercial sex acts, and identifying and addressing issues faced by trafficking victims.

Award: Total available funding is anticipated at \$1 million; 1 to 4 awards depending upon funds available and the number of high-quality applications

Eligibility: States, territories, local governments, Native American tribal governments that perform law enforcement functions (federally recognized), nonprofit and profit organizations, institutions of higher education, and certain qualified individuals

Independent Sector

Program: The Independent Sector presents the award each year to an individual whose leadership in or with the nonprofit community has been transformative and who has mobilized and unified people, institutions, or causes that improve people's lives. Anyone may nominate an individual for the award. Nominations should be made without the candidate's knowledge.

Award: \$10,000 award and a replica of an original relief bust of John Gardner by the late sculptor Frederick Hart.

Eligibility: Living Americans working in or with the nonprofit community, winner must be present at the award ceremony, which will be held at Independent Sector's Annual Conference in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, from November 9–11, 2008

Groves Conference on Marriage and Family

Program: This award was established to recognize the best research (journal article or book chapter) from recent years that supports the theme of the Groves Conference annual meeting. Winners are expected to present their award winning work at the annual meeting, which will be held in Ireland from May 31 - June 7, 2008. The conference theme is Globalization and Family Well-being. Appropriate publications could address issues such as immigrant families, economic viability of families, educational reform as a result of globalization, cultural implications of globalization and families, issues of transnational families, or the impact of globalization upon racism, peace processes, technological advances, or health.

Award: The award carries a stipend of \$1,000 and up to \$1,000 in travel expenses.

Borchard Foundation Center on Law and Aging*

Program: The purpose of this program is to encourage collaboration and develop effective partnerships among providers of law-related services to older persons, enhanced legal awareness and autonomy and promote the right of elders, improve elder access to the legal system and to serve as a catalyst for development of effective, permanent partnerships and resources and replication of successful projects.

Award: 8 grants at \$10,000 each

Eligibility: Non-profit, law-related organizations, including Older Americans Act and other publicly-funded legal services and elder rights and protection programs, state or local bar associations, law schools and law-related education groups, dispute resolution programs, and others providing legal services and seeking to strengthen legal awareness and the legal rights of vulnerable older Americans

Deadline: March 3, 2008

SCHOLARSHIPS/FELLOWSHIPS**FY 2008 Victim Assistance Fellowship***US Department of Justice, Office for Victims of Crime*

Program: The purpose of this fellowship is to provide direct operational assistance to crime victim organizations and agencies; design and develop innovative initiatives; develop and deliver training programs; and assist with evaluation and capacity building efforts. Fellowships specifically address sexual assault, human trafficking, public awareness, field outreach, and victims' rights enforcement.

Award: \$75,000 to \$125,000 for each of the three fellowships

Eligibility: Individuals who demonstrate the financial and organizational capacity to manage this cooperative agreement and must demonstrate a unique capability and strong desire to reach and serve victims of crime through activities that are national in scope.

Deadline: January 10, 2008
