OVW Federal Fiscal Year 2008 Grants to Reduce Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Sexual Assault, and Stalking on Campus Program

Program: The purpose of this program is to develop and strengthen victim services in cases involving domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking on campuses. The program also aims to strengthen security and investigative strategies to prevent and prosecute these crimes on campuses.

Award: Individual projects: up to \$300,000; Consortia projects: up to \$500,000

Eligibility: Institutions of higher education as defined under the Higher Education Amendments of 1998, consortium of higher education institutions may also apply provided that each individual member of the consortium is also eligible

Transitional Housing Assistance Grants for Victims of Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Stalking, or Sexual Assault Programs

Program: The purpose of this solicitation is to support programs that provide assistance to victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking who are in need of transitional housing, short-term housing assistance, and related support services.

Award: Applicants may apply for an amount equal to or less than a previous award that they have received to conduct the same or similar work; Applicants should base their award request on the amount of funds that were expended during a 36-month budget cycle and not solely on the amount that was previously

Eligibility: States, units of local government, Indian tribes, and other organizations, that have a documented history of effective work concerning domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking and are continuation applicants who received awards in Federal Fiscal Year 2005 may apply.

End Violence Against and Abuse of Women with Disabilities
Call for Concept Papers**

Program: The purpose of the program is to create sustainable, systemic change that will result in effective services for individuals with disabilities who are victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault and stalking and hold offenders accountable. The program will support education, cross training, capacity building and the establishment of multi-disciplinary teams at the local level.

Award: 6 to 15 multi-disciplinary teams with funding up to \$600,000

Eligibility: States, units of local governments, Indian Tribal governments or tribal organizations, nonprofit and nongovernmental victim services organizations, including faith-based and other community organizations, such as a state domestic violence or sexual assault coalition or a nonprofit, nongovernmental organization, including faith-based and other community organizations, serving disabled individuals

Deadline: Letters of Intent (LOI): January 31, 2008; **Grants.gov Registration:** February 7, 2008; **Application Deadline:** February 28, 2008

FY 2008 Legal Assistance for Victims Grant

Program: The intended purpose of this program is to increase the availability of civil and criminal legal assistance necessary to provide effective aid to adult and youth victims of domestic violence, dating violence, stalking, or sexual assault who are seeking relief in legal matters arising as a consequence of that abuse or violence.

Award: Projects serving 1-9 counties or a population of 500,000 or fewer will be awarded a maximum of \$450,000; projects serving 10 counties or more or a population of 500,001 and over but not more than 900,000 and not serving an entire state will be awarded a maximum of \$550,000; projects that are serving a population of 900,001 or are statewide will be awarded a maximum of \$650,000; applicants serving tribal areas may approximate the number of counties to be served; applications for continuation funding will be considered based at their current level

Eligibility: Eligible applicants that are not nonprofit, nongovernmental, domestic violence and/or sexual assault providers are required to enter into a collaborative working relationship with a nonprofit, nongovernmental, domestic violence and/or sexual assault program within the community to be served.

HEALTHY MARRIAGE**Improving the Well-Being of Children –
Native American Healthy Marriage Initiative (NAHMI)**

US Department of Health & Human Services, Administration for Native Americans

Program: This program area seeks to fund projects that engage in the planning and implementation of approaches to remove barriers to forming lasting families and healthy marriages in Native communities. The announcement is divided into two priority:

Category I - Improving the Well-Being of Children/Native American Healthy Marriage Initiative Project Planning and **Category II** - Improving the Well-Being of Children/Native American Healthy Marriage Initiative Project Implementation.

Award: **Category I:** Total available funding-\$500,000; 5 to 10 grants averaging \$100,000 each; **Category II:** Total available funding-\$2,000,000; 10 to 16 grants averaging \$200,000 each

Eligibility: Category I & II: Federally recognized Indian Tribes; consortia of Indian Tribes; incorporated non-Federally recognized Tribes; incorporated non-profit, multi-purpose, community-based Indian organizations; Urban Indian Centers; national or regional incorporated non-profit Native American organizations with Native American community-specific objectives; Alaska Native Villages and/or non-profit Village consortia; incorporated non-profit Alaska Native multi-purpose community-based organizations; non-profit Alaska Native Regional Corporations/Associations in Alaska with Village-specific projects; non-profit Native organizations in Alaska with Village-specific projects; public and non-profit private agencies serving Native Hawaiians; public and non-profit private agencies serving Native peoples from Guam, American Samoa, or the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands; Tribally controlled community colleges, Tribally controlled Post-Secondary Vocational Institutions, and colleges and universities located in Hawaii, Guam, American Samoa or the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, which serve Native Pacific Islanders; and non-profit Alaska Native community entities or Tribal governing bodies

CAPACITY BUILDING**Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) Training and Technical Assistance (T/TA) Program: Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) and Other Asset Formation Opportunities**

US Department of Health & Human Services, Office of Community Services

Program: This program provides capacity-building assistance that enables local, State or regional CSBG networks to plan, establish, improve or expand asset formation and financial service opportunities for eligible individuals and families.

Award: Total available funding: \$800,000; 16 awards averaging \$50,000 each

Eligibility: Any organization that was officially designated as a CAA or a community action program under Section 673(1) of the CSBG Act, and meets all the requirements under Section 673(1)(A) and 676A of the CSBG Act, statewide or local organizations, or associations with demonstrated expertise in providing training to individuals and organizations on methods of effectively addressing the needs of low-income families and communities

EDUCATION**Safe Schools/Healthy Students Program**

US Department of Education, Office of Safe and Drug-Free Schools

Program: This program supports the implementation and enhancement of integrated, comprehensive community-wide plans that create safe and drug-free schools and promote healthy childhood development. Plans must focus activities, curricula, programs, and services in a manner that responds to the community's existing needs in areas related to the five plan elements: *Safe School Environments and Violence Prevention Activities; Alcohol, Tobacco, and Other Drug Prevention Activities; Student Behavioral Social, and Emotional Supports, Mental Health Services; and Early Childhood Social and Emotional Learning Programs.*

Award: Total available funding: \$72 million; approximately 55 awards; Local Educational Associations with fewer than 5,000 students – maximum of \$750,000, Local Educational Associations with at least 5,000 students but fewer than 35,000 students – maximum of \$1,500,000; Local Educational Associations with at least 35,000 students – maximum of \$2,250,000

Eligibility: Local Educational Associations, including charter schools that are considered Local Educational Associations under State law, and consortia of Local Educational Associations
