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## **GOVERNMENT GRANTS TRIBAL COALITIONS**

### **OVW FY 2008 Tribal Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Coalitions Program**

*US Department of Justice, Office on Violence Against Women*

**Program:** The intent is to support the development and operation of nonprofit tribal domestic violence and sexual assault coalitions in Indian country. The goal is to build the capacity of victim service providers, survivors, and advocates to improve systemic and community responses to end violence against American Indian and Alaska Native women.

**Award:** New applicants-maximum of \$150,000; Current grantees-maximum of \$595,000

**Eligibility:** Established nonprofit, nongovernmental tribal coalitions, or individuals or organizations that propose to incorporate as nonprofit, nongovernmental tribal coalitions.

**Deadline: Pre-Application Conference Calls:** February 12 & 13, 2008 by 12 PM EST;  
**Grants.gov Registration:** February 13, 2008; **Application Deadline:** March 6, 2008

### **Standing Announcement for the Ethnic Community Self-Help Program**

*US Department of Health & Human Services, Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR)*

**Program:** The objective of this program is to strengthen organized ethnic communities comprised and representative of refugee populations to ensure ongoing support and services to refugees after initial resettlement. This announcement replaces the Priority Area Three - Ethnic Community Self-Help program included in the Standing Announcement for Services for Recently Arrived Refugees published in the *Federal Register* on April 23, 2004. Individuals with the following immigration statuses are eligible for refugee social services: refugees; asylees; Cuban and Haitian entrants; certain Amerasians from Vietnam; and victims of a severe form of trafficking who receive certification or eligibility letters from ORR, and certain other specified family members of trafficking victims.

**Award:** Total available funding: \$600,000; 3 to 8 awards averaging \$125,000 each

**Eligibility:** Public or private nonprofit agencies; faith-based and community organizations

**Deadline:** March 21, 2008; February 24, 2009; February 24, 2010

**Standing Announcement for Supplemental Services for Recently Arrived Refugees***US Department of Health & Human Services, Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR)*

**Program:** This program is intended to provide services to arriving refugees or sudden and unexpected large secondary migration of refugees where communities are not sufficiently prepared in terms of linguistic or culturally appropriate services. Individuals with the following immigration statuses are eligible for refugee social services: refugees; asylees; Cuban and Haitian entrants; certain Amerasians from Vietnam; and victims of a severe form of trafficking who receive certification or eligibility letters from ORR, and certain other specified family members of trafficking victims.

**Award:** Total available funding - \$4,300,000; 10 to 20 awards averaging \$200,000 each

**Eligibility:** Public or private nonprofit agencies; faith-based and community organizations

**Deadline:** March 24, 2008; February 24, 2009; February 24, 2010

**Standing Announcement for the Preferred Communities Program***US Department of Health & Human Services, Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR)*

**Program:** This program is intended to support resettlement of newly arriving refugees with the best opportunities for their self-sufficiency and integration into new communities, and to support refugees with special needs that require more intensive case management. Individuals with the following immigration statuses are eligible for refugee social services: refugees; asylees; Cuban and Haitian entrants; certain Amerasians from Vietnam; and victims of a severe form of trafficking who receive certification or eligibility letters from ORR, and certain other specified family members of trafficking victims.

**Award:** Total Available Funding - \$600,000; 2 to 6 awards averaging \$200,000

**Eligibility:** Eligible applicants are ten national voluntary agencies that currently resettle refugees under a Reception and Placement Cooperative Agreement with the Department of State or with the Department of Homeland Security: Church World Service, Inc.; Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society; Ethiopian Community Development Council, Inc.; Hebrew Immigrant Aid Society, Inc.; International Rescue Committee; Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service; State of Iowa; US Conference of Catholic Bishops; US Committee for Refugees and Immigrants; and World Relief Corporation.

**Deadline:** March 24, 2008; February 24, 2009; February 24, 2010

**HIV/AIDS****Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program Part D Grants for Coordinated HIV Services & Access to Research for Women, Infants, Children & Youth**  
*US Department of Health & Human Services, Health Resources & Services Administration*

**Program:** The purpose of this program is to improve access to primary medical care, research, and support services for HIV infected women, infants, children and youth, and to provide support services for their affected family members. Projects will link clinical research and other research with comprehensive care systems, and improve and expand the coordination of a system of comprehensive care for women, infants, children and youth who are HIV infected.

**Award:** Total available funding: \$17,874,003.00; 23 grants ranging from \$400,000 to \$1.6 million

**Eligibility:** Nonprofits having a 501 (C)(3) status with IRS, other than institutions of higher education

**Prevention of Substance Abuse (SA) and HIV for At-Risk Racial/Ethnic Minority Subpopulations Cooperative Agreements**

*US Department of Health & Human Services,  
Substance Abuse & Mental Health Services Administration*

**Program:** The Minority SA/HIV Prevention Initiative supports an array of community-level activities to prevent and reduce the onset of substance abuse and transmission of HIV/AIDS among at-risk racial/ethnic minority populations: reentry populations; men having sex with men; Black, Latina, or Hispanic women; adolescents; young adults; and older adults.

**Award:** Total available funding: \$17.89 million; 46 cooperative agreements each at \$400,000 per year

**Eligibility:** Community-level domestic public or private nonprofit entities

**RURAL COMMUNITY****Community Connect Broadband Program**

*US Department of Agriculture, Rural Development—Utilities Program*

**Program:** The program provides financial assistance to furnish broadband service in rural, economically challenged communities where such service does not currently exist. Grant funds may be used to deploy broadband transmission service to critical community facilities and rural residents and businesses and to construct, acquire, or expand, equip and operate a community center that provides free access to broadband services to community residents for at least two years.

**Award:** \$13.4 million

**Eligibility:** Nonprofit organizations, for profit organizations, government entities

**Program:** The purpose of this program is to have the intermediaries develop the capacity of nonprofits, low-income rural communities and tribes to undertake projects related to housing, community facilities and economic development.

**Award:** Total available funding: \$6,255,900; Minimum grant amount per intermediary is \$50,000; maximum grant amount per intermediaries is \$300,000

**PRIVATE GRANTS****LGBT COMMUNITY****Youth Courage Awards***Colin Higgins Foundation*

**Program:** This program honors lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, two-spirit, and queer youth, under the age of 21, who have demonstrated courage when faced with hostility and intolerance based on their gender and/or sexual orientation and triumphed over bigotry through working for LGBT rights and social justice.

**Award:** 2 awards of \$10,000 each which will be presented in New York City at the Trevor Project Benefit Gala in June 2008; awardees will also receive an expense-paid trip to the 2009 National Gay and Lesbian Task Force Creating Change Conference

**Eligibility:** Lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, two-spirit and queer youth under 21

**SOCIAL CHANGE****NetSquared Mashup Challenge***Net<sup>2</sup> : A project of TechSoup*

**Program:** The NetSquared Mashup Challenge is all about helping projects gain new insight into the data that applies to their mission-based activities. There are two distinct categories for this year's Mashup Challenge: **New Mashup Projects and Ready to Mash Projects**. **New Mashup Projects** applications represent mashups still in the idea or conceptual stage. These applications might have great potential to become mashups, but there is still a need for technical assistance to take the vision to the next level. These projects might need assistance from a business analyst or product manager to help build a specification so that an engineer can turn the vision into an application. **Ready to Mash Projects** have already completed what people in the web field call a specification for their mashup. Nonetheless, they might need additional design, engineering, or other technical or administrative support.

**Award:** Creation of social change ideas into a Mashup Project; 20 projects will share in \$100,000 prize money

**Eligibility:** Social entrepreneurs, not-for profit entities (applicants from other countries are encouraged to apply)

**Deadline:** March 14, 2008
