TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE & TRAINING

OJV Recovery Act Technical Assistance Program

US Department of Justice, Office on Violence Against Women (OVW)

Program: The purpose of this grant is to provide technical assistance and training to OVW Recovery Act grantees.

Award: Applicants should specify the requested award amount, based upon a realistic budget, and the proposed project period (12, 24 or 36 months). OVW has the discretion to make grants for greater or lesser amounts than requested and to negotiate the scope of work, timing and budget with applicants prior to award of a grant.

Eligibility: Any organization is eligible.

Deadline: May 29, 2009

OJJDP FY 09 Enforcing Underage Drinking Laws Discretionary Program Training and Technical Assistance

US Department of Justice, Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention

Program: The successful applicant will provide training and technical assistance support to state and local Enforcing Underage Drinking Laws (EUDL) programs and other entities, as directed by Congress or the Office of Justice Programs.

Award: One award up to \$2 million for a 1-year project period; the annual award amount will be renewable for a period not to exceed 4 years

Eligibility: Non-profit organizations that have capacity, knowledge, and experience in delivering national training and technical assistance on underage drinking prevention with a special emphasis on enforcing the underage drinking laws. Eligible applicants should have an in-depth knowledge of the Enforcing the Underage Drinking Laws program

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE & TRAINING**OJJDP FY 09 Improving Community Response to the Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children**

US Department of Justice, Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention

Program: The purpose of this funding is to support communities in combating the commercial sexual exploitation of children by improving training and coordination activities within the community.

Award: Four awards of up to \$500,000 each for a project period of 3 years

Eligibility: Public agencies (including state agencies, units of local government, public universities and colleges, and federally-recognized tribal governments) and private organizations (including faith-based and community organizations)

OJJDP FY 09 National Youth Mentoring Training and Technical Assistance Initiative

US Department of Justice, Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention

Program: This program will permit OJJDP to expand its national leadership role in the youth mentoring arena by advancing the capacity of State and local jurisdictions and Native governments to develop, implement, expand, evaluate and sustain youth mentoring efforts that incorporate research-based findings of best practices and principles. The training and technical assistance will provide support to mentoring programs and initiatives funded by OJJDP, including the Recovery Act National Mentoring Program and the Recovery Act Local Youth Mentoring Initiative.

Award: One award of up to \$1.5 million for a 24-month period

Eligibility: Public agencies (including State agencies, units of local government, public universities and colleges, and tribal governments) and private organizations (including faith-based and community organizations)

Program: The purpose of the grant is to implement a National Sexual Violence Resource Center to provide enhanced communication technology for information sharing and training and technical assistance for the Rape Prevention and Education (RPE) programs and other primary prevention partners that serve federal, state, local and Indian tribal agencies including state sexual assault coalitions and local sexual assault programs.

Award: Total available project funding: \$4.5 million for a 3 year project period; Total current fiscal year funding: \$1.5 million; 1 award for \$1.5 million

Eligibility: State sexual assault coalitions and Indian/Native American Tribes that receive the Sexual Assault Coalition Grants funded through the Violence Against Women Act

**OJJDP FY 09 Tribal Juvenile Detention and
Reentry Green Demonstration Program**

US Department of Justice, Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention

Program: This program enhances opportunities for federally recognized tribes to provide comprehensive and quality programs for tribal youth who reside within or are being released from tribal juvenile detention centers.

Award: Three awards of up to \$700,000 per award for a project period of 48 months

Eligibility: Federally recognized Indian Tribes that own and operate a tribal juvenile detention facility on their own tribal land or have tribal youth placed in a Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) operated juvenile detention center located within or near the tribe's land.

VIOLENCE PREVENTION & INTERVENTION**OJJDP FY 09 Gang Prevention Youth Mentoring Program**

US Department of Justice, Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention

Program: The purpose is to establish mentoring programs that offer a mixture of core services and engage youth with activities that enable them to practice healthy behaviors within a positive pro-social peer group. The target population should be youth at risk of gang activity, delinquency, and youth violence.

Award: Multiple awards of up to \$500,000 each for a 3-year project

Eligibility: Private organizations, federally recognized Indian tribes, nonprofits (including faith-based, community, and tribal organizations), and public agencies (including schools, colleges, universities, and units of local government) in communities that have completed a comprehensive community gang assessment

Deadline: June 15, 2009

OJJDP FY 09 Second Chance Juvenile Mentoring Initiative

US Department of Justice, Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention

Program: The purpose is to support mentoring and other transitional services essential to reintegrating juvenile offenders into the community. The grants will be used for mentoring juvenile offenders during confinement, through transition back to the community, and post-release; transitional services to assist the reintegration of youth offenders into the community; and training in offender and victims issues. A 25% match is required.

Award: \$625,000 per award for and award period of up to 3 years

Eligibility: Public agencies (including state agencies, units of local government, public universities and colleges, and federally-recognized Indian tribal governments) and private, nonprofit organizations (including faith-based and community organizations)

American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009 – Strengthening Communities Fund – Nonprofit Capacity Building Program

US Department of Health & Human Services, Office of Community Services

Program: The purpose of this program is to provide nonprofit organizations serving as project partners, with capacity building training, technical assistance, and competitive financial assistance. Lead organizations will assist grassroots organizations working in distressed communities with capacity building activities in five areas: organizational development, program development, collaboration and community engagement, leadership development and evaluation of effectiveness.

Award: Total available funding: \$34 million, 34 awards at \$1 million each per project period of 24 months; Grantees must provide at least 20 percent of the total approved cost of the project

Eligibility: State, county, city or township governments, public and state-controlled institutions of higher education, Indian/Native American Tribal governments (Federally recognized and other than Federally recognized tribal governments), Nonprofits with and without 501(c)(3) IRS status (other than institutions of higher education), private institutions of higher education, for-profit organizations, small businesses, special district governments

CAPACITY BUILDING**American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009 -
Strengthening Communities Fund - State, Local, and
Tribal Government Capacity Building Program**

US Department of Health & Human Services, Office of Community Services

Program: The purpose of this grant is to build the capacity of government offices or their authorized designee that provide outreach to community and faith-based organizations and to assist nonprofit organizations in addressing the broad economic recovery issues present in their communities, including helping low-income individuals secure and retain employment, earn higher wages, obtain better-quality employment and gain greater access to state and Federal benefits and tax credits.

Award: Total available funding: \$12 million; 48 awards averaging \$250,000 each per budget period; Grantees must provide at least 20 percent of the total approved cost of the project

Eligibility: State, county, city or township governments, Indian/Native American Tribal governments (Federally recognized), nonprofits with and without 501(c)(3) IRS status (other than institutions of higher education)

Deadline: July 7, 2009

RESEARCH**OJJDP FY 09 Field Initiated Research and Evaluation Programs**

US Department of Justice, Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention

Program: The goal of this program is to support original, rigorous, scientific research and evaluation studies to identify strategies, programs, and methods to assist states to achieve and maintain compliance with the four core requirements of the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act of 2002.

Award: Multiple grants with awards ranging between \$200,000 and \$500,000 for a project period of 36 months

Eligibility: Public agencies (including state agencies, units of local government, tribal governments, and public and tribal universities and colleges) and private organizations (including secular, faith-based nonprofit, and tribal organizations)

RESEARCH**OJJDP FY 09 Mentoring Research Program**

US Department of Justice, Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention

Program: This program seeks proposals to evaluate the effectiveness of paid versus volunteer mentors within an existing mentoring program. The evaluator will conduct both a process and an outcome evaluation measuring the success of both paid and volunteer mentor programs in preventing delinquency.

Award: One award of up to \$3.5 million for a 5-year project period

Eligibility: For-profit organizations, nonprofit organizations, faith-based and community organizations, institutions of higher learning, and consortiums with demonstrated organization and community-based experience in working with Native American and Alaska Native communities, including tribal commercial and nonprofit organizations, tribal colleges and universities and tribal consortiums
