HOUSING

Indian Community Development Block Grant (ICDBG) Program under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009

US Department of Housing and Urban Development

Program: The block grants may be used to improve housing stock, provide community facilities, make infrastructure improvements and expand job opportunities by supporting the economic development of their communities. Housing construction, rehabilitation, acquisition of land for housing, direct assistance to facilitate homeownership among low- and moderate-income persons, construction of tribal and other facilities for single or multi-use, streets and other public facilities and economic development projects are allowable activities under this funding.

Award: \$10 million is available with a grant ceiling of \$600,000

Eligibility: Indian tribes, tribal organizations on behalf of Indian tribes that received ICDBG grants in FY 2008

Deadline: July 7, 2009

Native American Housing Block Grant Program (NAHBG) under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009

US Department of Housing and Urban Development

Program: NAHBG assists tribes in developing, operating, maintaining and supporting affordable housing for rental and homeownership housing.

Award: Total available funding: \$242,250,000 for multiple awards; grant ceiling for each award is based on the amount of funds each tribe/TDHE received under the Recovery Act formula component.

Eligibility: Indian tribes and tribally designated housing entities

CAPACITY BUILDING**Community Services Block Grant Training and Technical Assistance Program – National Training for Financial Management and Administrative Governance**

Program: The purpose of this program is to support a 1-year program to refine the national technical assistance strategy and create a strengthened infrastructure to assist Community Services Block Grant entities with financial management and administrative governance needs.

Award: 1 award for \$250,000 for a 12-month project and budget period

Eligibility: Community Services Block Grant eligible entities, consisting of statewide or local organizations or associations, and non-profit organizations with demonstrated expertise in providing training to individuals and organizations on methods of effectively addressing the needs of low-income families and communities, and knowledge of and experience with the Community Services Network

ECONOMICS**2010 Low Income Taxpayer Clinic (LITC)**

Internal Revenue Service (IRS), Taxpayer Advocate Service

Program: LITCs represent low-income taxpayers before the IRS in audit, appeals, and collection issues and federal tax litigation for free or for a nominal charge. The clinics also provide educational workshops on tax issues to taxpayers for whom English is a second language.

Award: Grants up to \$100,000 each

Eligibility: Organizations exempt from tax under IRC Section 501(a) that represent low-income taxpayers in tax disputes, clinical programs at accredited law, business or accounting schools whose students represent low income taxpayers in tax disputes with the IRS

PRIVATE FUNDING**HUMAN SERVICES****2009 Harry Chapin Self-Reliance Awards**

World Hunger Year with support by the Harry Chapin Foundation

Program: The awards are presented to organizations judged outstanding for their innovative and creative approaches to fighting domestic hunger and poverty by empowering people and building self-reliance. Grantee programs must go beyond emergency food, shelter, and other types of assistance to address the root causes of poverty. Applications will not be considered from organizations providing only emergency services.

Award: Awards are up to \$7,000 each

Eligibility: Community-based, 501(c)(3) nonprofits located in the United States whose total budget cannot exceed \$500,000, organizations who have won an award in the past must wait a minimum of five years before applying again
