Partnership to Strengthen Families: Child Support Enforcement/Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)/University Partnership Demonstration Project

US Department of Health & Human Services,

Program: Funded projects would support partnerships among state child support enforcement, TANF agencies and university scholars and researchers for research and data analyses to inform Title IV-D agency policy and program implementation and improve coordination with the Title IV-D agency partners.

Award: \$500,000 for 8 awards

Program: OCSE is looking for projects that promote the basic themes of the national strategic plan in that child support should be a reliable source of income for families, and that child support agencies should, whenever possible, use early prevention strategies to help build a culture of compliance in which parents will support their children voluntarily and reliably. Projects should address immediate needs.

Award: \$1.2 million for 15 awards

CHILDREN & YOUTH**Support Systems for Rural Homeless Youth:
A Collaborative State and Local Demonstration**

US Department of Health & Human Services, Administration for Children & Families

Program: This project is intended to influence policies, programs and practices that affect the design and delivery of services to runaway and homeless youth in Transitional Living Programs (TLP), as well as to homeless youth aging out of State child welfare systems and into Independent Living Programs (ILP).

Award: 3 awards at \$200,000 each per budget period

Eligibility: Departments and/or agencies that administer independent living programs for youth aging out of foster care (e.g., Human Services and Child Welfare Agencies) in the 50 States, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico.

TECHNOLOGY**Broadband Technology Opportunities Program (BTOP)**

*US Department of Commerce,
National Telecommunications & Information Program (NTIA)*

Program: The Broadband Technology Opportunities Program (BTOP) makes available grants for deploying broadband infrastructure in unserved and underserved areas in the United States, enhancing broadband capacity at public computer centers, and promoting sustainable broadband adoption projects. This program will advance the objectives of the Recovery Act to encourage job creation and stimulate long-term economic growth and opportunity.

Award: Total available funding: \$1.4 billion; Broadband Infrastructure-up to \$1.2 billion, Public Computer Center-up to \$50 million, Sustainable Broadband Adoption-up to \$150 million

Eligibility: States, Territories, local governments, or any agency, sub-division, instrumentality, or political subdivision; District of Columbia, territories or possessions of the United States, Native American tribes, native Hawaiian organizations, nonprofit and for-profit organizations

Deadline: August 14, 2009

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT**Community Services Block Grant Training and
Technical Assistance Program-National Community
Economic Development Exemplary Practices Initiative**

*US Department of Health & Human Services,
Administration for Children & Families,
Office of Child Support Enforcement*

Program: The purpose of this program is to create an enhanced nationwide training and technical assistance strategy for community economic development carried out by the Community Action Network (CAN). This initiative will be a three-year effort, and will focus on strategies to improve the long-term economic well being of residents of low- and moderate-income communities. The focus will be on the identification, documentation, and dissemination of strategies that will enable CAN to revitalize communities, develop and rehabilitate affordable housing, promote sustainability and energy efficiency, attract investments, build wealth and encourage entrepreneurship.

Award: \$500,000 for one award

Eligibility: CSBG-eligible entities, statewide or local organizations or associations, and nonprofits with expertise in providing training to individuals and organizations on meeting the needs of low-income families and communities

Deadline: July 29, 2009

Economic Development Assistance Programs

US Department of Commerce, Economic Development Administration

Program: These programs promote comprehensive, entrepreneurial and innovation-based economic development efforts to enhance the competitiveness of regions, resulting in increased private investment and higher-skill, higher-wage jobs in areas experiencing substantial and persistent economic distress.

Award: Total available funding: \$197 million

Eligibility: District Organization; Indian Tribe or a consortium of Indian Tribes; State, a city or other political subdivision of a State, including a special purpose unit of a State or local government engaged in economic or infrastructure development activities, or a consortium of political subdivisions; institution of higher education or a consortium of institutions of higher education; or public or private non-profit organization or association acting in cooperation with officials of a political subdivision of a State

Deadline: Ongoing

Award: 11 awards of up to \$800,000 each

Assisting Communities***US Department of Housing & Urban Development, Office of University Partnerships*

Program: The funding provided assist AN/NHI to expand their role and effectiveness in addressing community development needs in their localities, including neighborhood revitalization, housing, and economic development, principally for persons of low- and moderate-income.

Award: Total available funding: \$3 million; 4 awards of up to \$800,000 each

Eligibility: Nonprofit Alaska Native and Native Hawaiian institutions of higher education

Program: Funds help tribal colleges and universities build, expand, renovate and equip their own facilities. The program helps expand the role of the TCUs in their community through the provision of needed services, such as health programs, job training, and economic development activities.

Award: \$5 million for 6 awards of up to \$800,000 each

Eligibility: Tribal colleges and universities (TCUs)

Rural Community Development Initiative (RCDI)*US Department of Agriculture, Rural Housing Service*

Program: RCDI funding helps develop the capacity and ability of nonprofit organizations, low-income rural communities, or federally recognized tribes to undertake projects related to housing, community facilities, or community and economic development in rural areas. These grants will be made to qualified intermediary organizations that will provide financial and technical assistance to recipients to achieve the goals.

Award: \$6.2 million for grants ranging from \$50,000 to \$300,000 each (a match at least equaling the federal grant is required)

Eligibility: Private nonprofits and public intermediary organizations

Deadline: September 24, 2009

ECONOMIC ADVOCACY**Recovery Act: Pathways Out of Poverty**

US Department of Labor, Employment & Training Administration

Program: This program provides funds for projects that provide training and placement services to prepare individuals seeking pathways out of poverty for careers in green industries. National and local applicants are expected to implement project activities at the community level. Projects in each community served must be implemented by a strategic partnership that includes: nonprofit organizations, the public workforce investment system, education and training organizations, labor organizations, and employers and industry-related organizations.

Award: \$150 million for grants ranging from approximately \$3 million to \$8 million for national grantees and approximately \$2 million to \$4 million for local grantees

Eligibility: National and local entities focusing one of the following: unemployed individuals, high school dropouts, individuals with criminal records, and/or disadvantaged individuals within areas of high poverty

Deadline: September 29, 2009

DISABILITIES**Keeping Up: Technology's Rapid Changes & Effects on People with Disabilities**

National Council on Disability (NCD)

Program: Grantee will evaluate how Americans with disabilities are faring in the new digital media age. NCD is interested in supporting a study examining the accessibility of new media and technologies developed, documenting successful development processes, understanding consumer needs, and identifying the facilitators and barriers to the technology transfer for employment purposes. The grantee will analyze six new media sources and/or digital technology products for their utility in employment settings, and their accessibility to people with disabilities. This analysis should include market trends, potential consumers, facilitators and barriers to expanding the market to employment settings, industry practice and accessibility. ***The inclusion of people with disabilities must be integral to the planning, development, and execution of this project.***

Award: \$150,000 for 1 award

Eligibility: Unrestricted

Deadline: August 7, 2009

PRIVATE FUNDING**CAPACITY BUILDING****Community Action Program***Gannett Foundation*

Program: The Gannett Foundation makes grants to eligible organizations in the communities in which Gannett does business. Priorities include: education and neighborhood improvement; economic development; youth development; community problem-solving; assistance to disadvantaged people; environmental conservation; and cultural enrichment. About 60% of the community grants funding goes for grassroots organizations focusing on social/human services, health, and mental health.

Award: Grants average between \$1,000 to \$5,000

Eligibility: 501(c)3 nonprofits

Deadline: August 17, 2009; February 16, 2010

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE**Pets and Women's Shelters Program (PAWS)***American Humane Society*

Program: This is a national initiative to promote on-site housing of pets at women's shelters and to acknowledge the human-animal bond, which can be crucial to recovery after a crisis.

Award: Varies

Eligibility: Only domestic/family violence and women's emergency sheltering agencies; nonprofit 501(c)(3) agencies and municipal agencies

Deadline: Open – no deadline

PHILANTHROPY**Civil Society***Mott Foundation*

Program: The goal of this program is to support a strong, independent and inclusive nonprofit and philanthropic sector where organizations excel in governance, management and public accountability; partner with the public and private sectors; work to improve race relations and racial equity; and build community assets to address community needs. The program objective is to strengthen the nonprofit sector and philanthropy by enhancing nonprofit and philanthropic accountability, membership associations, community foundations and diversity in philanthropy.

Award: Median grant size is in the \$100,000 range with the majority of grants ranging between \$15,000 and \$250,000 annually

Eligibility: Tax-exempt 501(c)(3) organizations

Deadlines: August 31, 2009 and December 31, 2009
