RESEARCH – VIOLENCE PREVENTION

Research Grants for Preventing Violence and Violence-Related Injury

Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC),
National Institutes of Health (NIH)

Program: The purpose of this program is to provide research that will expand and advance the understanding of violence, its causes, and prevention strategies. The research objectives are (1) to conduct studies that identify and evaluate efficient and effective methods for the dissemination and implementation of evidence-based interventions, programs, and policies to prevent either the perpetration of or victimization from violence, (2) to evaluate the efficacy, effectiveness, and cost effectiveness of primary prevention strategies, programs, and policies to prevent the perpetration of violence (**funds are available to conduct studies aimed at preventing the perpetration of intimate partner violence, sexual violence, youth violence, child maltreatment, and/or suicidal behavior**), and (3) to conduct studies to examine the development of intimate partner violence, sexual violence and/or child maltreatment perpetration.

Award: Total available funding: \$2 million; 5 awards at a maximum amount of \$400,000 per budget year

Eligibility: Public nonprofit organizations; private nonprofit organizations; for profit organizations; small, minority, and women-owned businesses; universities; colleges; research institutions; hospitals; community-based organizations; faith-based organizations; federally recognized or state-recognized Native American/Alaska Native tribal governments; Native American/Alaska Native tribally designated organizations; Alaska Native health corporations; urban Native American health organizations; tribal epidemiology centers; state and local governments or their Bona Fide Agents and political subdivisions of states

VICTIMS OF CRIME**Developing and Enhancing Statewide Automated
Victim Information and Notification (SAVIN) Programs
FY2009 Competitive Grant Announcement**

Program: This program provides registered victims with timely and accurate information about any changes to the status of their offender (trial dates, times, or changes; probation hearings; inmate relocation; and offender release). The key components of the SAVIN program are governance, technology, project design, and program management. Implementation and enhancement grants are available.

Awards: Category I: Implementation – Grant maximum: \$2.25 million; Category II: Enhancement – Grant maximum: \$500,000

Eligibility: State government agencies authorized to manage the planning and implementation of a SAVIN program. Native American/Alaska Native tribes and/or tribal organizations are also eligible.

Deadline: January 8, 2009

Program: The Housing Impact Grants program is designed to assist nonprofit organizations in North America whose projects involve affordable housing built responsibly in a timely manner.

Award: Grants range from \$1,000 to \$3,000

Eligibility: Nonprofit organizations that have 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status in the United States, or that have a notification of registration and confirmation of registration from the Canadian Customs and Revenue Agency Charities Division in Canada.

Program: This is an advertising grant within the Google AdWords™ program. AdWords is an online self-managed advertising program where an organization will manage its advertising campaign by creating and monitoring text ads that run on Google.

Award: In-kind online advertising account that can be used for general outreach, fundraising activities, and recruitment of volunteers.

Eligibility: United States organizations must have 501(c)(3) status, organization must have its own website, and its ads must link to a page on its website, keywords must be relevant to the organization's programs and services, the organization's website cannot display revenue generating ads, such as Google AdSense or affiliate advertising links, while participating in Google Grants and the active management of the advertising campaign is the organization's responsibility once the account is active.

Program: The Justice Prize is an international award, presented annually, that honors individuals who have advanced the cause of justice as delivered through the legal system. The award both acknowledges individual efforts and encourages further advancements toward bringing about a fundamentally just world.

Award: \$500,000 cash prize and a gold medal

Eligibility: Individuals or organizations whose contributions have advanced the cause of justice as delivered through the legal system.

Award: \$500,000 and a gold medal

Program: The goal of the Arcus LGBT Program is to advance social justice inclusive of sexual orientation, gender identity and race. The Impact Fund

Program: The Impact Fund provides grants in the general areas of social & environmental justice, human and civil rights, and poverty. Areas of focus are applications that address systemic deprivations of constitutional or statutory rights in criminal justice and immigration, education access and equity, and post 9/11 cases involving denial of rights under the guise of "Homeland Security".

Award: The Impact Funds awards grants four times per year, with the average grant size being \$10,000 - \$15,000. The maximum grant amount awarded to any single applicant per year is \$25,000.

Eligibility: Private attorneys, small legal firms or nonprofit legal entities that do not have sufficient access to funding sources

Deadline: Pre-application Deadline: November 21, 2008;

Program: This program encourages the creation and expansion of services for grandparents and other relatives who serve as surrogate parents when biological parents are unable to care for their children.

Award: 1 mini-grant of \$10,000 for each selected organization over a two-year period (\$6,000 for year 1 and \$4,000 for year 2)
