GOVERNMENT CONTRACTS-PREVENTION EDUCATION

Prevention Education and AIDS-Related Services for Survivors of Domestic Violence

Department of Health And Human Services, Office on Women's Health

Program: The major aim of this program is to educate counselors about how they can incorporate HIV/AIDS prevention strategies, and to assist HIV/AIDS service providers in delivering HIV/AIDS-related services in a manner that is sensitive to the unique social and emotional challenges of the victims/survivors. The programs should be specifically designed to serve female survivors and victims of domestic violence. The contractor is to cross train professionals on strategies to address the intersection between HIV and Violence when working with their clients.

Award: The award document will be a contract. It will be made on a fixed price basis and will not exceed \$100,000.

Eligibility: The Contractor will have knowledge and experience working with the domestic violence and HIV/AIDS professional community. *Details are available in Statement of Work on the website.*

Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) Prevention Projects for Community-Based Organizations

*US Department of Health & Human Resources,
Centers for Disease Control and Prevention*

Program: The purpose of this program is to develop and implement HIV prevention programs that provide HIV prevention services for members of racial/ethnic minority communities in which there may be a high risk for HIV infection and for members of groups in which there may be a high risk for acquiring or transmitting HIV infection, regardless of race/ethnicity.

Award: Total estimated funding: \$43 million; 145 awards with a ceiling of \$500,000

Eligibility: 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations, community- and faith-based organizations, hospitals

Deadlines: Letter of Intent: September 9, 2009; Application Deadline: October 26, 2009

GOVERNMENT FUNDING-HOUSING**FY 2009 Assisted Living Conversion Program (ALCP)
for Eligible Multifamily Housing Projects**

*US Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD),
Office of the Assistant Secretary for Housing-Federal Housing Commissioner*

Program: The purpose of this program is to provide grants for the conversion of some or all of the dwelling units in an eligible project into assisted living facilities (ALFs) for frail elderly persons and people with disabilities who need certain support services such as assistance with eating, bathing, grooming, dressing, and home management activities.

Award: Total available funding: \$20 million

Eligibility: Private nonprofit owners of eligible multifamily assisted housing developments specified in section 683(2) (B), (C), (D), (E), (F), and (G) of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1992 may apply.

Deadline: November 5, 2009

FY 2009 Service Coordinators in Multifamily Housing

*US Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD),
Office of the Assistant Secretary for Housing-Federal Housing Commissioner*

Program: The Service Coordinator program allows multifamily housing owners to assist elderly individuals and non-elderly people with disabilities living in HUD-assisted housing and in the surrounding area to obtain needed supportive services from the community, to enable them to continue living as independently as possible in their homes.

Award: Total available funding-\$90 million of which \$20 million is available for funding new Service Coordinator programs

Eligibility: Owners of eligible multifamily assisted developments

Deadline: November 5, 2009

GOVERNMENT FUNDING-HOUSING**Section 202 Supportive Housing for the Elderly**

US Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD), Office of Housing

Program: The purpose of this program is to provide funding for the development and operation of supportive housing for very low-income persons 62 years of age or older. Eligible activities include new construction, rehabilitation, or acquisition of housing.

Award: Available funding: Approximately \$420.9 million in capital advance funds plus associated project rental assistance contract (PRAC) funds and any carryover funds

Eligibility: Private nonprofit organizations and nonprofit consumer cooperatives

Deadline: November 13, 2009

Section 811 Supportive Housing for Persons with Disabilities

US Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD), Office of Housing

Program: This program provides funding for the development and operation of supportive housing for the very low-income persons who are at least 18 years old.

Award: Approximately \$90.6 million in capital advance funds plus associated project rental assistance contract (PRAC) funds and any carryover funds

Eligibility: 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations

Deadline: November 16, 2009
