### TRAFFICKING

#### Rescue & Restore Victims of Human Trafficking Regional Program Department of Health & Human Services, Office of Refugee Resettlement

**Program:** This program is expanding its efforts by funding regional grantees that will serve as focal points for an intensification of local outreach to and identification of victims of severe forms of trafficking in persons.

**Award:** Total available funding: \$2.2 million; 9 to 10 awards at average of \$200,000 per budget period

**Eligibility:** Unrestricted; The applicant should have in-depth knowledge of the geographical area in which it will conduct the work, as well as be familiar with the national, regional and local organizations that are involved in anti-trafficking work. The applicant must be located within the region in which it proposes to work.

**Deadline: Letter of Intent (LOI):** November 19, 2008;

#### National-Scope Demonstration Project Postsecondary Education: Integrating Crime Victims' Issues into University and College Curricula

US Department of Justice, Office for Victims of Crime (OVC)

**Program:** This program supports the integration of broad crime victims' issues into university and college curricula.

**Award:** 1 award of \$300,000

**Eligibility:** Private, faith-based, tribal, or state consortiums of accredited universities and colleges or associations of institutions of higher education that can demonstrate knowledge and understanding of victimization issues to be integrated into university or college curricula; experience in augmenting university or college curricula by incorporating emerging education issues; and staff resources and capability to carry out all activities required by the funded project.

**HEALTH****National Maternal and Child Health Data Resource Center  
Cooperative Agreement Program (DRC CAP)**

*US Department of Health & Human Services,  
Health Resources and Services Administration*

**Program:** The grantee of this program will partner with states, families and other experts, in leading a project to help ensure that the continued investments made in the national surveys lead to effective, efficient and maximum use of these data by state, local and national Maternal and Child Health (MCH) and Children with Special Health Care Needs (CSHCN) leaders as well as by their family and community partners. The DRC will include data use support features, easy to understand resource materials, training modules, and technical assistance that specifically respond to the needs and preferences of national, state, community and family constituencies but particularly to State Title V programs.

**Award:** 1 award at \$525,000

**Eligibility:** public or private entity, including an Indian tribe or tribal organization (as those terms are defined at 25 U.S.C. 450b), faith-based and community organization is eligible to apply for this federal funding opportunity.

**MENTAL HEALTH****Campus Suicide Prevention Grant**

*US Department of Health & Human Services,  
Substance Abuse & Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA)*

**Program:** This program is designed to assist colleges and universities in their efforts to prevent suicide attempts and completions and to enhance services for students with mental and behavioral health problems, such as depression and substance abuse, which put them at risk for suicide and suicide attempts.

**Award:** Total available funding: \$2.1 million; 21 awards at a maximum of \$100,000 per year for 3 years

**Eligibility:** Public and private institutions of higher education

**Deadline:** November 25, 2008

**RESEARCH****The Influence of Religiosity and Spirituality on Health Risk Behaviors in Children and Adolescents (R21)**

*US Department of Health & Human Services, National Institutes of Health*

**Program:** This program funds research studies that are qualitative, quantitative, and combined methods; that examine the mechanisms, mediators, and moderators by which religious and spiritual beliefs develop and are transmitted across generations; and whether and how these beliefs influence early sexual behaviors and alcohol or other drug use that may facilitate the transmission of HIV in children and adolescents.

**Award:** The total amount awarded and the number of awards will depend upon the quality, duration, costs, and mechanism number of the applications received; the maximum amount allowed in direct costs per year is \$200,000

**Eligibility:** For profit or non-profit organizations; public or private institutions; units of state and local governments; eligible agencies of the federal government; domestic or foreign institutions/organizations; faith-based or community-based organizations; Indian/Native American Tribal Government (federally recognized); Indian/Native American tribal government (other than federally recognized); and Indian/Native American tribally designated organizations.

**The Influence of Religiosity and Spirituality on Health Risk Behaviors in Children and Adolescents (R03)**

*US Department of Health & Human Services, National Institutes of Health*

**Program:** This program funds research studies that are qualitative, quantitative, and combined methods; that examine the mechanisms, mediators, and moderators by which religious and spiritual beliefs develop and are transmitted across generations; and whether and how these beliefs influence early sexual behaviors and alcohol or other drug use that may facilitate the transmission of HIV in children and adolescents.

**Award:** Direct costs of up to two \$25,000 modules, or \$50,000 per year

**Eligibility:** For profit or non-profit organizations; public or private institutions; units of state and local governments; eligible agencies of the federal government; domestic or foreign institutions/organizations; faith-based or community-based organizations; Indian/Native American Tribal Government (federally recognized); Indian/Native American tribal government (other than federally recognized); and Indian/Native American tribally designated organizations.

**RESEARCH***(Continued)***National Study of Collateral Consequences for Criminal Convictions***US Department of Justice, National Institute of Justice*

**Program:** The purpose of this research is to inform and improve criminal justice policy and practice by providing policymakers with the information they need to understand the legal and regulatory barriers that may affect successful offender reentry into the community.

**Award:** 1 award; up to \$750,000 may become available for an award made through this solicitation, all NIJ awards are subject to the availability of appropriated funds and to any modifications or additional requirements that may be imposed by law

**Eligibility:** States (including territories), local governments (including federally recognized Indian tribal governments that perform law enforcement functions), nonprofit and profit organizations (including tribal nonprofit and profit organizations), institutions of higher education (including tribal institutions of higher education), and certain qualified individuals. Foreign governments, foreign organizations, and foreign institutions of higher education are not eligible to apply
