OVW FY 2009 Transitional Housing Assistance Grants for Victims of Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Stalking, or Sexual Assault Program

Program: This program support programs that provide assistance to victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking who are in need of transitional housing, short-term housing assistance, and related support services.

Award: Maximum amount of \$250,000 per award

Eligibility: Domestic violence and sexual assault victim service providers, domestic violence and sexual assault coalitions, other nonprofit, nongovernmental organizations, faith-based and community organizations, and culturally specific organizations **that have a documented history of effective work concerning domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking**, Native American/Alaska Native tribe, band, nation or other organized group or community, states, and local units of government are eligible. Both current and new applicants can apply.

Deadline: Letters of Intent (LOI): December 2008 (No date specified); **Grant.gov Registration Deadline:** December 24, 2008; **Application Deadline:** January 8, 2009

OVW FY 2009 STOP Violence Against Women Formula Grant Program

Program: The STOP (Services Training Officers Prosecutors) program provides support to communities in their efforts to develop and strengthen effective law enforcement and prosecution strategies to combat violent crimes against women and to develop and strengthen victim services in cases involving violent crimes against women.

Award: OVW will award a base amount of \$600,000 to each state. Funds remaining after the allocated base amount will be distributed among the states according to population. The most accurate and complete data compiled by the United States Bureau of the Census is used to determine the state populations. By statute, Indian tribal populations are not included in the population count.

Eligibility: Any state of the United States, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, American Samoa, Guam, and the Northern Mariana Islands

Application Deadline: January 9, 2009

OVW FY 2009 Grants to Encourage Arrest Policies and Enforcement of Protection Orders Programs

Program: The Grants to Encourage Arrest Policies and Enforcement of Protection Orders Program is designed to encourage state, local, and tribal governments and state, local, and tribal courts to treat domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault and stalking as serious violations of criminal law requiring the coordinated involvement of the entire criminal justice system.

Award: Awards are based upon the service area population formula:

<u>Service Area Population</u>	<u>Budget Cap</u>
Up to 500,000	\$ 400,000
500,001 to 900,000	\$ 750,000
Over 900,000	\$1,000,000

Eligibility: States, units of local government, Native American tribal governments, and state, tribal, territorial and local courts are eligible to apply. Applications will be accepted from both current and new applicants.

OVW FY 2009 Legal Assistance to Victims (LAV) Grant Program

Program: The objective of the LAV Grant Program is to develop innovative, collaborative projects that provide quality representation to victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking.

Award: 1) Projects serving 1-9 counties or serving a population of 500,000 or fewer will be awarded a maximum of \$450,000; 2) projects serving 10 counties or more or serving a population of 500,001 and over but not more than 900,000 and not serving an entire state will be awarded a maximum of \$550,000; 3) projects that are statewide or serving a population of 900,001 or more will be awarded no more than \$650,000; 4) applicants serving tribal areas may approximate how many counties would be involved in their proposed project to determine their budget request

Eligibility: Private nonprofit entities, including faith and community-based organizations; publicly funded organizations not acting in a governmental capacity; territorial organizations; Indian tribal governments; and tribal organizations; Applications will be accepted from both new and current grantees. **Eligible applicants that are not nonprofit, nongovernmental, domestic violence and/or sexual assault providers are required to enter into a collaborative working relationship with a nonprofit, nongovernmental, domestic violence and/or sexual assault program within the community to be served.**

OVW FY 2009 Enhanced Training and Services to End Violence Against and Abuse of Women in Later Life Program

Program: This grant funds programs that provide or enhance training and services to address elder abuse, neglect, and exploitation, including domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking, involving victims who are 50 years of age or older.

Award: New funding: maximum of \$400,000 for a 36 months period; continuation funding: maximum of \$150,000 for a 24 month period

Eligibility: Nonprofit, nongovernmental victim services organizations with demonstrated experience in assisting elderly women or demonstrated experience in addressing domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking, including faith- and community-based organizations, states, units of local government or Indian tribal governments or tribal organizations are eligible to apply. Applications will be accepted from both new and current grantees. Recipients of Federal FY 2008 Elder Grants Program funding are not eligible to apply.
