DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, DATING VIOLENCE, SEXUAL ASSAULT, STALKING

OVW FY 2009 Rural Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Sexual Assault and Stalking Assistance Program

US Department of Justice, Office on Violence Against Women

Program: The purpose of this program is to enhance the safety of child, youth and adult victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking by supporting projects designed to address and prevent these crimes in rural jurisdictions.

Award: The award period for the grants will be 24 months. Projects serving: 1-4 rural counties will receive up to \$350,000; 5-8 rural counties will receive up to \$700,000; 9 or more rural counties will receive up to \$900,000

Eligibility: States, Indian tribes, local governments, and nonprofit, public or private entities, including faith-based, community and tribal nonprofit organizations; applications will be accepted from both current grantees and new applicants

Deadlines: Letters of Intent (LOI): January 7, 2009; Grants.gov Registration: January 7, 2009; Application Deadline: February 4, 2009

Women's Mental Health and Sex/Gender Differences Research (R21)

US Department of Health & Human Services, National Institute of Mental Health (NIMH)

Program: This funding opportunity announcement (FOA) solicits exploratory and developmental research grant applications on women's mental health and sex/gender differences in mental health across the lifespan. This program announcement identifies three major areas for research emphasis: basic and clinical neuroscience; epidemiology and risk factors; and intervention and services research.

Award: \$275,000 per 2-year period

Eligibility: For profit organizations; non-profit organizations; public or private institutions, such as universities, colleges, hospitals and laboratories; units of state government; units of local government; eligible institutions of the federal government; domestic institutions; foreign institutions; faith-based or community-based organizations; units of state tribal government; and units of local tribal government

VICTIMS OF CRIME**Intensive Case Management for Family Members of Homicide Victims in Rural Areas**

US Department of Justice, Office for Victims of Crime

Program: The grantee is to identify, institutionalize, and replicate promising practices related to the provision of a comprehensive array of services to family members of homicide victims in rural areas. In the first 12-month phase of this project, funding will be used to develop or enhance a comprehensive service strategy for services to family members after a homicide.

Award: 1 award for \$200,000

Eligibility: Private nonprofit organizations, including faith-based and community-based organizations, colleges or universities, tribal organizations, or public agencies that can demonstrate knowledge and understanding regarding the service needs of families after a homicide; experience in program development and implementation of direct service programs for crime victims and their families; and staff resources and capability to carry out all activities required by the funded project

Enhancing Public Awareness and Outreach for Victims in Underserved Communities

US Department of Justice, Office for Victims of Crime

Program: The grantees are to raise awareness among underserved populations regarding victims' rights and available resources for crime victims in the local community

Award: Total available funding: \$375,000; 5 awards of up to \$75,000 each

Eligibility: Private nonprofit organizations, including faith-based and community-based organizations, or public agencies that can demonstrate: knowledge and understanding of the victimization issue or victimization-related issue to be highlighted in the public awareness campaign; experience in the provision of victim services and advocacy; and staff resources and capability to carry out all activities required by the funded project; a private nonprofit organization does not need to have 501(c)(3) status to apply for grant funding under this solicitation

**Action Partnerships for National Membership,
Professional and Community Service Organizations***US Department of Justice, Office for Victims of Crime*

Program: The focus of this program is to conduct a national scope project to promote awareness and advocacy for the rights and needs of crime victims. The project should expand the members' knowledge and understanding of issues related to serving crime victims, and encourage members who work with crime victims to integrate this information into their daily practices.

Award: Total available funding: \$500,000; 5 awards at \$100,000 each

Eligibility: National nonprofit membership, professional and community service organizations or affiliation groups and tribal organizations and must demonstrate the financial and organizational capacity to manage this cooperative agreement. Applicants must demonstrate a unique capability and strong desire to reach and serve victims of crime through a project that is national in scope. Local or state chapters of such groups may apply based on membership, profession, or affiliation, but must document a close partnership with their national office to achieve national capacity for the dissemination of this project. A private nonprofit organization does not have to have 501(c)3 status to apply for grant funding under this solicitation

HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS**Family Preservation - Improving the Well-Being of Children Project Planning**

US Department of Health & Human Services, Administration for Native Americans

Program: Projects funded under this program announcement will include activities that design and engage in a community planning process that identifies barriers to forming healthy families, relationships and marriages; assess the needs and interest of the community to participate in a family strengthening project; assess existing absentee parenting programs, fatherhood programs, grandparents raising grandchildren programs and foster parent programs; identify strategies to implement a family strengthening project; plan and develop curricula for family strengthening programs; and develop projects that are designed to reduce or eliminate the challenges and barriers identified by the community.

Award: Total available funding: \$1 million; 10 awards averaging \$75,000 each

Program: Funds are available for projects that implement approaches to improve child well-being by removing barriers associated with strengthening families, forming and preserving healthy families, relationships and marriages. The FY 2009 focus is on strengthening children, families and communities through financial assistance to community-based organizations including faith-based organizations, Tribes and Village governments.

Award: Total available funding: \$3 million; 10 awards averaging \$200,000 each

Program: The W.E.B. Du Bois Fellowship sponsors research to provide objective, independent, evidence-based knowledge and tools to meet the challenges of crime and justice. Researchers may choose to focus on: immigration, crime, and victimization, trafficking in human beings, transnational crime police-community relations, courts, sentencing, and corrections, civil rights, or ethnographic studies.

Award: 1 award at \$75,000

Eligibility: States (including territories), local governments (including federally recognized Indian tribal governments that perform law enforcement functions), nonprofit and profit organizations (including tribal nonprofit and profit organizations), institutions of higher education (including tribal institutions of higher education), and certain qualified individuals
