VIOLENCE PREVENTION - CAMPUS

OVW FY 2009 Grants to Reduce Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Sexual Assault, and Stalking on Campus Program

US Department of Justice, Office on Violence Against Women

Program: The purpose of the Campus Program is to develop and strengthen victim services on campuses and to strengthen security and investigative strategies to prevent and prosecute these campus crimes.

Award: Individual projects-up to \$300,000; consortia projects-up to \$500,000

Eligibility: Institutions of higher education, a consortium of higher education institutions; Both new applicants and current grantees issued awards in Federal Fiscal Year 2006 are eligible to apply.

Deadline: March 11, 2009

SEXUAL ASSAULT

OVW FY 2009 Sexual Assault Services Formula Grant Program

US Department of Justice, Office on Violence Against Women

Program: The purpose of this grant is to provide intervention, advocacy, accompaniment support services, and related assistance for adult, youth, and child victims of sexual assault, family and household members of victims, and those collaterally affected by the sexual assault. This grant program provides four different funding streams for states and territories, tribes, state sexual assault coalitions, tribal sexual assault coalitions, and culturally specific organizations.

Award: A base amount will be awarded to each state and territory based on population

Eligibility: Any state of the United States, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, American Samoa, Guam, and the Northern Mariana Islands

Deadline: April 17, 2009

EDUCATION/TRAINING**FY 2009 State Victim Assistance Academy Initiative***US Department of Justice, Office for Victims of Crime*

Program: The purpose of this program is to fund new State Victim Assistance Academies. The State Victim Assistance Academies provide comprehensive, academically based, fundamental education and training for victim assistance providers, victim advocates, criminal justice personnel, and allied professionals who routinely work with victims of crime.

Award: 6 awards of \$35,000 each

Eligibility: Applicants are limited to public agencies, colleges and universities, state governments, and private, state-based nonprofit organizations. Applications are limited to states that do not currently have a State Victim Assistance Academy

Deadline: April 1, 2009

Training and Technical Assistance for Children's Justice Act (CJA) Partnerships for Indian Communities Grant Program*US Department of Justice, Office for Victims of Crime*

Program: The purpose of this grant is to provide hands-on, culturally relevant training and technical assistance to Native American and Alaskan Native (AI/AN) grantees who have received funding through the FY09 CJA Partnerships for Indian Communities Discretionary Grant Program. Training should focus on multidisciplinary approaches to investigating, prosecuting, treating, and advocating for victims of child abuse and child sexual abuse and should include strategies for minimizing trauma to child victims and maximizing needed services to victims.

Award: 1 award at \$500,000

Eligibility: Nonprofit organizations, including faith-based and community organizations, must have demonstrated ability to provide culturally relevant training and technical assistance to tribes and tribal communities, have expert knowledge of the issues surrounding the investigation, prosecution and case management of child abuse and sexual abuse in Indian Country

CHILDREN & YOUTH**Children's Justice Act (CJA) Partnerships
for Indian Communities Grant Program**
US Department of Justice, Office for Victims of Crime

Program: The purpose of this program is to help Native American and Alaska Native (AI/AN) communities develop, establish, and operate specialized services and procedures to improve the investigation, prosecution, and overall handling of cases of child abuse, and to address the needs of AI/AN child abuse victims in a manner that lessens the trauma to the victims and increases culturally appropriate service provision.

Award: Total available funding: \$2.5 million; 15 awards

Eligibility: Federally recognized Indian tribes and nonprofit tribal organizations

Program: This solicitation provides for social and behavioral research and evaluation on topics relevant to State and/or local criminal and juvenile justice policy and practice. NIJ has identified the following priority areas: predicting crime, emerging crime, human trafficking, prisoner re-entry programs, gang related crime prevention and intervention, improving the criminal justice system: prosecution and defense and reduction of correctional populations.

Award: Total available funding: \$10 million

Eligibility: States (including territories), local governments (including federally recognized Indian tribal governments that perform law enforcement functions), nonprofit and profit organizations (including tribal nonprofit and profit organizations), institutions of higher education (including tribal institutions of higher education), and certain qualified individuals

Award: At least 1 scholarship per year; awardee will receive financial support allowing them to attend the Annual Natural Hazards Research and Applications Workshop. Scholarships can cover part or all of transportation, meals, and Workshop registration costs

Eligibility: All hazards practitioners, students, and researchers are eligible. Preference will be given to those who have never attended the Workshop and who can demonstrate financial need.

2009-10 Atlas Corps International Fellowship Program*Atlas Service Corps*

Program: The 2009-10 program begins in early September with a weeklong orientation and training session and will provide a full-time on-the-job training experience as well as knowledge and skill-building opportunities aimed at creating future nonprofit leaders.

Award: Each fellow will receive assistance in applying for a J-1 travel visa, international travel to and from the host placement, a modest living stipend, medical insurance, and a \$2,500 end-of-service award. Fellows will be placed for a full time, 50-week volunteer position at an outstanding Colombian or U.S. nonprofit organization.

Eligibility: Mid-career nonprofit leaders in Latin America, India, Southeast Asia, and the United States; three or more years of experience in the nonprofit/NGO/social sector, a bachelor's degree, excellent written and verbal English skills, if volunteering in Colombia, you must also speak, read and write an outstanding level of Spanish, be applying to a country other than where you are from and be committed to returning to your home country at the end of the program
