Continuum of Care Homeless Assistance Program (NOFA) *Department of Housing and Urban Development*

Office of the Assistant Secretary for Community Planning and Development

Program: This Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) establishes the funding criteria for the Continuum of Care (CoC) Homeless Assistance Grant Programs. The purpose of the program is to reduce the incidence of homelessness in CoC communities by assisting homeless individuals and families to move to self-sufficiency and permanent housing. Programs in this announcement are Supportive Housing Program (SHP), Shelter Plus Care (S+C) and Section 8 Moderate Rehabilitation Single Room Occupancy (SRO).

Award: Approximately \$1.43 billion is available for funding.

Eligibility: The program summary chart in Section III.A.1 of this NOFA identifies the eligible applicants for each of the three programs under the CoC Homeless Assistance Programs.

Family Unification Program (FUP)

Department of Housing and Urban Development

Office of Public and Indian Housing/Office of Public Housing and Voucher Programs

Program: FUP is a program under which vouchers are provided to families for whom the lack of adequate housing is a primary factor in the imminent placement of the family's child, or children, in out-of-home care; or the delay in the discharge of the child, or children, to the family from out-of-home care. Youths at least 18 years old and not more than 21 years old (have not reached their 22nd birthday) who left foster care at age 16 or older and who do not have adequate housing are also eligible to receive housing assistance under the FUP. As required by statute, an FUP voucher issued to such a youth may only be used to provide housing assistance for the youth for a maximum of 18 months.

Award: This NOFA announces the availability of approximately \$14.6 million to fund approximately 1940 new FUP vouchers in FY 2009.

Eligibility: PHAs that have demonstrated experience with FUP or similar programs and resources for supportive services are eligible to apply for funding under this announcement.

Program: The purpose of this program is to support States, political subdivisions within States, the District of Columbia, Territories, Native American Tribes and tribal organizations, in developing integrated home and community-based services and supports for children and youth with serious emotional disturbances and their families by encouraging the development and expansion of effective and enduring systems of care.

Award: Estimated 16 awards of up to \$1 million

Eligibility: State governments; Indian Tribes or tribal organizations; governmental units within political subdivisions of a State; District of Columbia; Puerto Rico, Northern Mariana Islands, Virgin Islands, American Samoa, and Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands (Palau, Micronesia, Marshall Islands)

Deadline: December 8, 2009

Statewide Family Network Grants*Department of Health and Human Services**Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration*

Program: The purpose of this program is to enhance State capacity and infrastructure to be more oriented to the needs of children and adolescents with serious emotional disturbances and their families.

Award: Up to \$60,000 per year in total costs (direct and indirect); up to 6 grantees will receive an additional \$10,000 per year for projects that include a youth leadership component.

Eligibility: Domestic public and private nonprofit entities that meet the criteria for family-controlled organizations

Statewide Consumer Network Grant Department of Health and Human Services Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration

Program: The purpose of this program is to enhance statewide consumer run organizations to promote service system capacity and infrastructure development to be consumer-centered and targeted toward recovery and resiliency, and consumer-driven by promoting the use of consumers as agents of transformation. For the purposes of this funding opportunity, this program seeks to address the needs of underserved and under-represented consumers; of consumers with histories of trauma, veterans, or those who have been involved in the criminal justice system; and/or to promote activities related to partnership development, coalition building, legacy planning, and economic empowerment as part of the recovery process for consumers.

Award: Up to \$70,000 per year for up to 3 years

Eligibility: Domestic public and private nonprofit entities that meet the criteria for consumer-controlled organizations and that are not current recipients of a SAMHSA Statewide Consumer Network grant.

Deadline: November 25, 2009

2009 Mobile Government Grant Program ESRI and Trimble

Program: The program is designed to foster innovative approaches to solving government problems through the combined use of GIS, GPS, mobile, and server technology. Applicant projects must demonstrate increased efficiencies in collecting data for decision support or increased productivity in delivering government services.

Award: Packages of hardware, software, and training valued at \$89,980 each will be awarded to twenty state and local government agencies in the United States.

Eligibility: All state and local governments in the United States and all disciplines

Do Something Awards to Honor Young Social Change Activists (formerly the Brick Awards)

Do something.org Grants Program

Program: The Do Something Award winners will have identified a problem and have devised clear and measurable methods for addressing the problem; made a significant long-term commitment to improving the lives of others; cultivated long-term and respectful relationships within their community; demonstrated that they have directly and individually fueled the success of their work; extensively and tangibly improved the lives of others (the award is not for ideas); created great awareness about their issues or causes; serve as program founders and/or leading activist/advocates; have a clear growth plan for their work that ensures sustainability and continued impact; and already be recognized as top leaders within their issue or cause.

Award: The 2010 awards program will present four winners with \$10,000 each, and one grand-prize winner with \$100,000 toward their organization or cause. Each winner has the option of receiving up to \$5,000 as an educational scholarship.

Eligibility: The applicant must be 25 or under, and must be a U.S. or Canadian citizen. Partnerships or larger groups should select an individual they believe would best represent the project for the application.
