GOVERNMENT FUNDING INTERPERSONAL VIOLENCE

FY 2010 Rural Sexual Assault, Domestic Violence, Dating Violence and Stalking Assistance

US Department of Justice, Office on Violence Against Women (OVW)

Program: The program furthers the department's mission by supporting projects designed to address and prevent sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence and stalking in rural jurisdictions. Applicants must propose to do at least one of the following: implement, expand and establish cooperative efforts and projects among law enforcement officers, prosecutors, victim advocacy groups and other related parties to investigate and prosecute incidents of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence and stalking; provide treatment, counseling, advocacy and other long- and short-term assistance to adult and minor victims of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence and stalking in rural communities, including assistance in immigration matters; and/or working in cooperation with the community to develop education and prevention strategies directed toward such issues.

Award: Multiple awards: Projects serving 1-4 counties-maximum of \$350,000; projects serving 5-8 counties-maximum of \$750,000; projects serving 9 or more counties-maximum of \$900,000

Eligibility: States; Indian Tribes; Local Governments and Nonprofit, public or private entities, including Tribal nonprofit organizations; All eligible applicants must demonstrate that the target area to be served is a rural area or community, as defined by 42 U.S.C., § 13925(a)(21).

FY 2010 The Community-Defined Solutions to Violence Against Women Program Solicitation

US Department of Justice, Office on Violence Against Women (OVW)

Program: This program is designed to encourage communities to treat sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence and stalking as serious violations of criminal law requiring the coordinated involvement of the criminal justice system.

Award: Multiple awards: population up to 500,000-\$400,000; population from 500,001 to 900,000-\$750,000; population over 900,000-\$1,000,000

Eligibility: States, units of local government, Native American tribal governments, and state, tribal, territorial, and local courts (including juvenile courts)

Deadline: Letters of Intent (LOI) Deadline: February 3, 2010; GMS Registration Deadline: February 3, 2010; Application Deadline: February 17, 2010

HEALTH – VIOLENCE PREVENTION**Project Connect: A Coordinated Public Health Initiative to Prevent Domestic and Sexual Violence**

The Family Violence Prevention Fund (FVPPF), supported by the US Department of Health & Human Services, Office on Women's Health (OWH)

Program: The Family Violence Prevention Fund (FVPPF) is launching a new multi-state initiative, *Project Connect: A Coordinated Public Health Initiative to Prevent Domestic and Sexual Violence*, supported by the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), Office on Women's Health (OWH). This initiative is a result of funding from the Violence against Women and Department of Justice Reauthorization Act of 2005. The FVPPF is working with the OWH to identify and partner with statewide teams to develop policy and public health responses to domestic and sexual violence in women's health programs. The period of funding is for March 2010 through August 30, 2011.

Award: Seven (7) awards at \$100,000 each for the first two years; a 25% match is required (\$25,000 – can be in-kind)

Eligibility: Eligible applicants include states, territories or tribes that demonstrate a strong history of collaboration between public health and domestic and sexual violence prevention fields

RE-ENTRY**Second Chance Act Adult & Juvenile Offender Reentry**

US. Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance

Program: The Second Chance Act authorizes grants to state and local governments and federally recognized Indian tribes for demonstration projects to promote the safe and successful reintegration of incarcerated individuals into the community. Allowable funding uses include employment services, substance abuse treatment, housing, family programming, mentoring, victim services, and methods to improve release and revocation decisions using risk assessment tools.

Award: Multiple awards of up to \$750,000

Eligibility: State, local and tribal governments

Deadline: GMS Registration Deadline: March 4, 2010; Application Deadline: March 4, 2010

COURTS-SUBSTANCE ABUSE**Enhancing Adult Drug Court Services, Coordination & Treatment**

*US Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) and
US Department of Health & Human Services,
Center for Substance Abuse Treatment (CSAT)*

Program: In this joint proposal, applicants are to propose a comprehensive strategy to enhance court services, coordination and substance abuse treatment and recovery support services.

Award: 31 awards with a maximum of \$625,000; Grantees will receive two separate awards. BJA will make a one-time award of up to \$300,000 (match is required) per grantee, for the 3-year grant period. CSAT will make annual awards, up to \$325,000 per grantee, for each year of the 3-year period.

Eligibility: States, state courts, local courts, counties, other units of local government or Indian tribal governments

**Adult Drug Court Discretionary Grant Program
FY 2010 Competitive Grant Announcement**

US Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA)

Program: This program will provide financial and technical assistance to states, state courts, local courts, and units of state, local, and tribal governments to implement and enhance drug treatment courts that effectively integrate substance abuse treatment, mandatory drug testing, sanctions and incentives, and transitional services in a judicially supervised court setting with jurisdiction over nonviolent, substance abusing offenders. Programs funded by Drug Court discretionary grants are required by law to target nonviolent offenders and must implement a drug court based on 10 key components. This program supports adult drug court implementation and enhancement and statewide drug court enhancement and coordination.

Award: 3 award categories: Category 1: Implementation-maximum of \$350,000 for a project period of 36 months; Category 2: Enhancement-maximum of \$200,000 for a project period of 36 months; Category 3: Statewide-maximum of \$1.5 million for a project period of 36 months

Eligibility: For Implementation and Single Jurisdiction Enhancement Grants-applicants are limited to states, state and local courts, counties, units of local government and federally recognized Native American tribal governments; for Statewide Grants-applicants are limited to state agencies such as the State Administering Agency (SAA), the Administrative Office of the Court, or the State Alcohol and Substance Abuse Agency

VICTIMS OF CRIME**Developing and Enhancing Statewide Automated Victim Information and Notification (SAVIN) Programs
FY 2010 Competitive Grant Announcement**

US Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance

Program: SAVIN helps states obtain effective technology to manage critical information about offenders in near real time. Successful applicants will either develop a new statewide-automated victim information and notification capacity or enhance an existing SAVIN program. Through SAVIN, victims can access critical information through a Web site and toll free number with support from a live operator 24 hours a day; register to be notified via telephone, e-mail, telecommunication device for the deaf (TDD), or a written letter each time the status of their offender or case changes; and access information about their offender's arrest, initial incarceration, pretrial release, judicial process, final disposition, post-conviction incarceration, and community supervision. There are three categories of funding: Category 1: Automated Victim Notification System Implementation, Category 2: Automated Victim Notification Enhancement, and Category 3: Development of Information Exchange Standards.

Award: Category 1: Maximum of \$2.25 million with a project period of up to 24 months; Category 2: Maximum of \$500,000 with a project period of up to 24 months; Category 3: Maximum of \$450,000 with a project period of up to 12 months; There is a match requirement (cash or in-kind).

Eligibility: Categories 1 and 2: State government agencies authorized to manage the planning and implementation of the SAVIN program and federally recognized Native American tribes; Category 3, applicants are limited to public and nonprofit organizations and for-profit entities that agree to waive all profits and fees and have experience and expertise in the development of information exchange standards.

PRIVATE FUNDING**WOMEN****Open Meadows Provides Grants***Open Meadows Foundation*

Program: Open Meadows Foundation is a grant-making organization for projects that are led by and benefit women and girls, particularly those from vulnerable communities. Open Meadows Foundation funds projects that do not discriminate on the basis of race, religion, national origin, gender identity and expression, sexual identity and expression, age or ability.

Award: Grants up to \$2,000

Eligibility: Projects that: are designed and implemented by women and girls; reflect the diversity of the community served by the project in both its leadership and organization; promote building community power; promote gender, racial, social, economic and environmental justice; have limited financial access or have encountered obstacles in their search for funding and have organizational budgets that do not exceed \$150,000

Deadline: February 15, 2010 and August 15, 2010

Program: Ben & Jerry's Foundation supports programs and projects that are examples of creative problem solving. Projects must lead to societal, institutional and/or environmental change, address the root causes of social or environmental problems, and lead to new ways of thinking and acting.

Award: Varies

Eligibility: Grassroots, constituent-led organizations focusing on systemic social change, organizations must have 501(c)3 status, organizations with budget under \$250,000

FELLOWSHIPS**Wellstone Fellowship for Social Justice***Families USA*

Program: The Wellstone Fellowship is designed to advance social justice through healthcare advocacy by focusing particularly on the unique challenges facing communities of color. The primary responsibilities include assisting in the organization of trainings for community leasers and journalists; drafting policy briefs, fact sheets, and other publications.

Award: The fellowship provides a year-long, full-time, salaried position in Washington, DC.

Eligibility: Candidates seeking consideration for the Wellstone Fellowship must demonstrate an interest in health care policy as a tool for reducing racial and ethnic health disparities; demonstrate a commitment to contributing to social justice work following their year of hands-on experience as a fellow; be authorized to work in the United States and have a college degree or plan to receive a degree by August 2010. There is no minimum GPA requirement, and candidates from all academic backgrounds are encouraged to apply.
