Office on Violence Against Women (OVW) Grants OVW FY 2010 Grants to Enhance Culturally and Linguistically Specific Services for Victims of Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Sexual Assault and Stalking Program

Program: This program creates a unique opportunity for targeted community-based organizations to address the critical needs of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking victims in a manner that affirms a victim's culture and effectively addresses language and communication barriers.

Award: Award amounts will range from \$150,000 to \$300,000

Eligibility: Community-based programs whose primary purpose is providing culturally and linguistically specific services to victims of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking and community-based programs whose primary purpose is providing culturally and linguistically specific services and who can partner with a program having demonstrated expertise in serving victims of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking. Programs previously funded under this program are ineligible for FY 2010 funding.

OVW FY 2010 Sexual Assault Services Culturally Specific Grant Program (SASP)

Program: This purpose of SASP Culturally Specific Grant Program funds is to provide core sexual assault services and related assistance to victims of sexual violence including advocacy, crisis intervention, supportive short term counseling and accompanying the victim through the criminal justice system, medical treatment, and other social services.

Award: Up to \$300,000 for an award period of 36 months

Eligibility: Private nonprofit organizations focusing primarily on culturally specific communities

OVW FY 2010 Sexual Assault Services Formula Grant Program

Program: The purpose of this program is to support the establishment, maintenance and expansion of rape crisis centers and other programs and projects to assist those victimized by sexual assault.

Award: Total award amount: \$7.8 million for 56 awards; OVW will award a base amount to each State and Territory. Funds remaining after the allocated base amount will be distributed among the States and Territories based on population, including Tribal populations. The award period is 24 months.

Eligibility: Any State of the United States, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, American Samoa, Guam, and the Northern Mariana Islands

Deadline: GMS Registration Deadline: February 23, 2010; Application Deadline: March 9, 2010

FY2010 Grants to Reduce Sexual Assault, Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, and Stalking on Campus Program

Program: The Campus Program supports activities that develop and strengthen victim services in cases involving sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking on campuses. The Campus Program supports a coordinated community approach that enhances victim safety and assistance, and supports efforts to hold offenders accountable. To be effective, campus responses must be linked to local criminal justice agencies and service providers, including local law enforcement agencies, prosecutors' offices, courts and nonprofit, nongovernmental victim advocacy and victim services agencies.

Award: Individual project awards: up to \$300,000; consortia project awards: up to \$500,000

Eligibility: Institutions of higher education, consortium of higher education institutions may also apply provided that each individual member of the consortium is also eligible to apply; OVW will accept applications from current grantees who received 3-year awards in or prior to 2007 and applicants that have not previously received funding under this program

OVW Education, Training and Enhanced Services to End Violence Against and Abuse of Women with Disabilities

Program: This program provides training, consultation and information on sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence and stalking against individuals with disabilities to improve the response to such crimes and enhance direct services to such individuals.

Award: **Applicants not previously funded:** Up to \$600,000 for a state-focused collaborative and up to \$450,000 for a local-focused collaborative for a 36 month period; **Applicants funded in FY 2006 or 2007:** Up to \$450,000 for a state-focused collaborative and \$400,000 for local-focused collaborative for a 24 month period

Eligibility: Eligible applicants include: States and territories, units of local governments, Indian Tribal governments or Tribal organizations, nonprofit and nongovernmental victim services organizations, such as state domestic violence or sexual assault coalitions, or nonprofit, nongovernmental organizations serving disabled individuals. OVW will accept applications from applicants that received 3-year cooperative agreements in FY 2006 and FY 2007 and applicants that have not previously received funding under this program.

OVW FY 2010 Safe Havens: Supervised Visitation and Safe Exchange Grant Program

Program: This program provides an opportunity for communities to support supervised visitation and safe exchange of children in situations involving domestic violence, dating violence, child abuse, sexual assault, or stalking.

Award: Up to \$400,000 for a three-year development project; up to \$350,000 for a three-year continuation project with one visitation site; up to \$500,000 for a three-year continuation project with two visitation sites; up to \$650,000 for a three-year continuation project with three visitation sites

Eligibility: States, Indian Tribal governments and units of local government; All applicants are required to enter into a collaborative working relationship with State or local courts and a nonprofit, nongovernmental domestic violence or sexual assault victim services organization to expand the scope of existing services for supervised visitation and safe exchange of children in situations involving domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence, stalking, and child abuse.

OVW FY 2010 Enhanced Training and Services to End Violence Against and Abuse of Women Later in Life Program

Program: The program supports comprehensive approaches to address elder abuse in communities. Projects will: provide training to criminal justice professionals, governmental agency staff and victim assistants to enhance their ability to address elder abuse, neglect and exploitation in their communities; provide cross training opportunities to professionals working with older victims; develop or enhance a community coordinated response to elder abuse; and provide or enhance services for victims who are 50 years of age or older.

Award: Total available funding: \$3 million; 8 awards of up to \$400,000

Eligibility: States, units of local government, Indian Tribal governments or Tribal organizations, and nonprofit, nongovernmental victim services organizations with demonstrated experience in assisting elderly women or demonstrated experience in addressing sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking, including faith- and community-based organizations

OVW FY 2010 Transitional Housing Assistance Grants for Victims of Sexual Assault, Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, and Stalking Program

Program: The grant funds of this program are used to provide services only to victims of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and/or stalking, and their children and dependents. OVW is interested in programs that provide a broad range of holistic, victim-centered transitional housing services that move individuals to permanent housing, including transportation, counseling, child care services, case management and employment counseling.

Award: up to \$250,000 per award

Eligibility: States, units of local government, Indian tribes, and other organizations, including faith-based and other community organizations, that have a documented history of effective work concerning sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence and stalking

Deadline: Letters of Intent (LOI) Deadline: February 17, 2010; GMS Registration Deadline: February 17, 2010; Application Deadline: March 9, 2010

FY 2010 National Criminal History Improvement Program (NCHIP) Solicitation

US Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS)

Program: The NCHIP grant program furthers the Department's mission to enhance the crime fighting and criminal justice capabilities of state governments by improving the accuracy, utility, and interstate accessibility of criminal history records and enhancing records of protective orders involving domestic violence and stalking, sex offender records, automated identification systems and other state systems supporting national records systems and their use for criminal history background checks.

Award: Varies

Eligibility: Applicants are limited to the agency designated by the Governor in each state to administer the NCHIP program. States may choose to submit applications as part of a multi-state consortium or other entity.

Deadline: GMS Registration Deadline: March 1, 2010; Application Deadline: March 1, 2010

State Justice Statistics Program for Statistical Analysis Centers, 2010

US Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS)

Program: The 2010 State Justice Statistics (SJS) Program supports the collection, analysis, and dissemination of statistical information on crime and criminal justice at the state and local level. The SJS Program is designed to maintain and enhance each state's capacity to address criminal justice issues through collection and analysis of data. The program provides limited funds to coordinate statistical activities within the state, conduct research as needed to estimate impacts of legislative and policy changes, and serve a liaison role in assisting BJS to gather data from respondent agencies within their states. Each application for funding under this program must identify the participating organizations in the state and the particular issues to be addressed. **BJS encourages SACs to utilize the state's criminal history records for research purposes. In particular, the SAC may wish to seek SJS funds to support studies of patterns of criminal behavior such as sex offending, stalking, or domestic violence.**

Award: The average award per state is \$50,000.

Eligibility: Applicants are limited to Statistical Analysis Centers (SACs) established by state legislation or executive order

US Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJS)

Program: The program provides services and programs to facilitate inmates' successful reintegration into society.

Award: Awards up to \$300,000 will be given

Eligibility: Native American tribal governments (Federally recognized), nonprofits having a 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education, nonprofits that do not have a 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education

Deadline: GMS Registration Deadline: March 18, 2010; Application Deadline: March 18, 2010

**SMART FY 2010 Comprehensive Approaches
to Sex Offender Management Grant Program**

*US Department of Justice, Office of Sex Offender Sentencing, Monitoring,
Apprehending, Registering, and Tracking (SMART)*

Program: The program assists state, local and tribal jurisdictions in improving their adult and juvenile sex offender management policies and practices by critically examining existing approaches to monitoring and managing the population; identifying significant gaps and needs; and developing strategies to address the needs. This program provides funding to support demonstration projects in tribal communities that wish to implement the Comprehensive Approach model of sex offender management and to enhance existing sex offender management practices in communities in order to meet an identified need or to implement an innovative strategy that can be recognized as a best practice. The program has two components: Part A which is the demonstration program to implement the Comprehensive Approach model of managing sex offenders, reducing recidivism and promoting public safety and Part B which supports enhancements to existing approaches to managing released sex offenders.

Award: Part A funding awards grants of up to \$250,000; Part B funding awards grants of up to \$150,000

Eligibility: Federally recognized Indian tribes are eligible to apply for Part A funding; Part B funding is restricted to States, the District of Columbia, territories, and local units of government
