Information about the National Coalition of Anti-Violence Programs

The core of the mission of the National Coalition of Anti-Violence Programs (NCAVP) is to educate the general public around the existence and extent of violence against and within the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and HIV-affected (LGBTH) communities. NCAVP's mission also includes encouraging and participating in the development of policies that assist victims and survivors of violence and help to change a social atmosphere that condones and perpetuates many forms of violence, especially against LGTBH individuals and communities.

NCAVP also provides rapid incident response to critical incidents of anti-LGTBH violence around the country and helps local communities, survivors, and families in coping with such incidents. Further, NCAVP provides support to local communities seeking to create long-term responses to violence through technical assistance, guidance, and information and materials-sharing with the goal of creating more local anti-violence programs across the country.

Each year, NCAVP hosts the Roundtable and the Regional Training Academy. The Roundtable is designed to bring all member programs together for support, information sharing, and strategic planning for the year. The Regional Training Academy provides trainings about violence within and against LGBTH individuals and communities for those interested in increasing their knowledge base regarding working with LGTBH victims and survivors of violence.

Members are encouraged to join one of four committees designed to maximize the effectiveness of NCAVP on local, state, and national levels.

- **The Advisory Committee** is responsible primarily for guiding the overall direction of the coalition.
- **The Steering and Communications Committee** drives our rapid incident response as well as decision making regarding position and policy statements. This committee also helps to publicize and communicate internal decisions and policies.
- **The Education and Organizing Committee** develops the NCAVP Roundtable and Regional Training Academy content. It also helps to identify and address the general training needs of membership.
- **The Membership Committee** identifies new potential members in either existing or new organizations and assists in recruiting new members.
